This, certainly, is a terrible condition to which we have brought ourselves—"the liberties of the country actually destroyed." What a punishment people we are! We come to be thus treated, under the banner of Liberty! Shall we endure "chains and slavery" with patience, or like brave men rush again to the front and struggle to be free? We might go on in this patriotic strain, but we wait for the Fourth of July. We have no desire to rush anymore. We have no longer any liberty to demand, no more dungeons and death are the spectacles of our pathway. But the Herald is not afraid of the tyrant—the noble warriors of that sheet will stand to the satisfaction, if need be, in vindication of liberties. We have seen the book of martyrs will go out of print and future generations will read with horror, and ponder deeply, over a record of such martyrs as the world has never before seen, doubt, less entitled "Asses book of martyrs." The poor oppressed saints who preside over that immortal newspaper may, however, console themselves, if they will, with being the solitary victims among some 45,000,000 of people of a royal despotism, and they shall reap all the glory—gloria de potestate mundi.

In managing the canvass on behalf of the Republicans of this State, the Chairman of the State Committee took pains to solicit assistance from the National Committee in the way of speakers. His was answered by Mr. H. J. Johnson, who had been in the same direction with him in the same direction. The answer was the same in all cases: "We look upon Texas as a hopeless case, not worthy any effort on our part. If the people there cannot perceive their true interests, they must take the consequences. Do the best you can."

Well, we have done the best that possibly could have been done. The Chairman of the State Committee has never received a dollar from a single office holder to aid him in promoting the cause of the Republic. What means the expected help from the National Committee? It has been a long time since there has been no local organization whatever, and he has had not only to print tickets free of charge, but to employ men and horses to distribute them. Had this not been done, the local Republicans took so little interest in the canvass, that tickets would not have been found at half the price in the State. But this is not the worst. Men in high and lucrative Federal offices have never, by word or deed, during the canvass, done anything to help their struggling brethren. In some instances, we are credibly informed, they have even thrown cold water upon the efforts of local Republicans.

The election, therefore, has gone to a great extent, by default, at a time too when a vigorous canvass would utterly have destroyed the sold-out Democracy.

We do not mention these things in the spirit of fault-finding, but to cause a correction, if possible, of the evils in the party. Another election, and an important one, is but a year off. No time is to be lost in organizing for it, if we desire or hope to cut any figures in electing the next Governor of this State.

There is an absolute ludicrousness in the manner in which the democratic press of this State receives the triumph of the national republican party. There are scarcely any two who feel and express themselves similarly upon the subject. One assigns one cause, and one another, and none agree; meanwhile others ignore the subject altogether and crow lustily over the state triumph. It is the "crow of the cook which in terror has crawled outside of the chicken yard, and there proclaims himself master of the situation. In a false attitude before the country and will suffer by it; but she will not suffer by the result of this election one iota as much as she will in the event the next Legislature shall devote its time to reorganizing the government instead of passing good laws, repealing bad ones, and correcting defective ones. Such a course will be sure to restore the republicans to power in this State, but we prefer that the party shall restore itself, rather than triumph because of wrongs perpetrated by its opponents from which the people must suffer.
