An Important Decision.

An important decision has just been rendered by the Supreme Court of Maryland in regard to the religious belief of witnesses. The case in question was an action for debt, where the defense made objection to a, witness on the ground of religious belief. The objection was founded on the old common law rale, as well as a provision in the State Constitution providing that a belief in the existence of a God, with a system of future reward and Saipe on toast would be almost punishment, was the only requisite. It was shown by direct testimony to impeach the witness that, so far as could be gathered from his expression' he came within both these imitations. In rebuttal it mas shown that the witness did not believe in a personal God, but only in a Supreme Spirit pervading nature. The court held tha a belief in a personal God was not necessary; and that the witness, by ac knowledging merely the existence of a Supreme Being or Power, established his competency to testify.
