FORT SILL, INDIAN TENETIONY Office Klowa Agency, Nov. 16, 1872. Mr. Kohn, Respected Friend.

On the 14th inst, I recovered from th Comanche Indians two captive white. children, apparently 12 or 13 years old One of them says that he was captured about three years ago, while hearding sheep, and that his name is Adolph Kohn. He can speak both in German and English. He says that his home was near Liano, not far from San Antonio. Please come or send for him. I think there will be no danger in coming here at present Post, Red River Station.

The other boy has been with the Indiana about ten years, he thinks, and has lost all knowledge of the English language, and his name. He can only remember that his father was called John and his mother Sarah. The latter was killed when he was taken, and his father and sister were from home. He thinks the Indians killed several other persons on that raid, but took no other captives.

On the 24th ult I recovered two captives of the Indians. The name of one of them is Clinton Smith, whose parents live at Boerne, Texas. The other is a boy eight or nine years, and has been with the Indians so long as to lose the English language, but thinks that his father's name was Topiah, and that his father, mother aud sister were all killed when he was taken, somewhere in Texas.
