THE INTERNATIONAL AND GREAT NORTHERN RAILROAD COMPANIES.
We learn with much pleasure that Gen. Galusha A. Grow, President of the Houston and Great Northern Railroad Company, has been elected also to the Presidency of the International Railroad Company. These two important roads will in future be conducted under one management and will form one road. The financial interests of these roads have from the outset been identical, and the consolidation is dictated by plain business considerations. Little, if any, change we believe will take place in the personnel of the management. The consolidated company will have not later than the first of next month three hundred miles of road in running order, and another hundred will be added before February next. It is expected that the northward extension to Red river will be pushed forward with Gen. Grow's accustomed energy, and that in a comparatively brief period connection with Eastern Texas, Kansas, St. Louis and New York will be made.

In Memoriam.
Colonel Thos. Wm. Ward departed this life on this morning at 4 o'clock at his residence in this city. Another old Texan has been called to appear before the Supreme Judge of the universe. Colonel Ward came to Texas at an early day with a patriotic devotion to the best interests of the young Republic, he freely gave his every energy to its prosperity, and perhaps no man did more to secure the independence of Texas than Colonel Ward. In the fight at San Antonio he lost his leg, and in firing a salute to the anniversary of the Declaration of Texas Independence in March, 1841, he unfortunately lost his arm. He has held many offices of high trust and responsibility all of which he filled with honor to business and to the satisfaction of the people. The position of Commissioner of the General Land Office he held for many years, and to him, more than any other man in Texas, are the people indebted for an admirable system in the Land Office to-day. Colonel Ward, like the balance of mankind, had his faults, but his many virtues overrode them. He was generous to a fault, and he was never known to desert a friend. May the old patriot and hero rest in peace.

A Russian Marriage Ceremony.
The bride and bridegroom held a lighted taper in their hands in front of a small altar placed in the center of the church. Rings were placed on their fingers, and their hands being joined, they were led by the pope three times round the altar. Two highly ornamental gift boxes were placed on their heads and held over them by the groomsmen during part of the services. They drank wine out of a cup three times, and kissing one another, the ceremony was finished. The married couple then made tour of the church, crossing themselves at each altar, and the ceremony dinner commences at the bride's father. At a marriage feast lighted candles are placed in every position and corner possible. No other wine but champagne should be drunk, and the quantity consumed of this beverage is remarkable. The dinner is followed by a ball, and the feasting is usually kept up for twenty-four hours. The custom of honeymooning does not exist in Russia. The married couple spend the first few days of their wedded life with the bride's father. Shortly after the marriage the bride and bridegroom meet and upon every one of their relations, friends, and acquaintances, and after this ceremony is finished they sink back into their ordinary life—*Los at Home.*

SOLOMON says: "He that regardeth the clouds shall not reap," but the reapers on the Rhone have lately been studying the clouds to some purpose—they have succeeded in manufacturing them to order. Successful experiments, according to the Lyons Process, have been undertaken by the Vine Dressers' Congress for the production of artificial clouds. Tin receivers, filled with a peculiarly prepared tar, were disposed over an area of many acres, and when the tar was ignited thick white clouds rose into the atmosphere, and spreading out evenly over a large region, remained suspended several yards above the soil. The reader will at once understand the object and the use of the device. In seasons when frost is feared the tar-clouds would interpose between the crops and the sky, thus checking the night radiation which often causes such ravages

as in vineyards and gardens, both in spring and at harvest time. This experiment of the French husbandmen is therefore something more than a curious scientific feat—it is a valuable agricultural contrivance, all the more useful from the simplicity and cheapness of its machinery, a few dollars' worth of tar, being ample provision for a season until the dangers of frost are passed, or till the crops can no longer be injured. This device for clothing the fields with a protecting robe of vapor, taken together with the well known process of cannonading the clouds to make them "tell their beads in drops of rain," show how the modern farmer may shape the elements to his purposes, and rob even cloud-compelling Zeus of his fabulous attributes.

Anecdote of Chief Justice Marshall.
Judge Marshall's simplicity of character and absent-mindedness have been the theme of a number of anecdotes. The one best known is about his puzzle over the buggy and the sapling. Turning aside one day to avoid one of those awful mud holes which abound in Virginia country roads, the axle of his buggy encountered a stout sapling. The sapling was between the hub of the wheel and the body of the buggy. Too big to bend down and too supple to break, this sapling seemed to the judge to be wholly unconquerable. What to do he knew not. He got down out of the buggy the better to apply his great intellect to the knotty subject and to study it thoroughly up. While pondering vainly, a negro man came along.
"Uncle," said the Chief Justice, "I wish you would tell me about this sapling. I can't get over it, and can't get around it, and I don't want to stay here all day and miss court. What do you think I had better do?"
The negro could not repress a broad but silent grin. "Why, ole marster," said he, "I 'spec' de best thing you kin do is to back yo' buggy till you git clear of de sapling, den turn de hade (head) of yo' hoss, and den you kin 'void de sapling, and go to cote alick as goose goes."
"Thank you—thank you kindly, uncle; I should never have thought of that in the world. You are a man of superior mind. There's half a dollar for you." And the judge drove joyfully off.

The Harvest of the Mind.
When the comb cuts a rake, bringing away a roll of parted fibers every time it passes through the hair, baldness would soon be inevitable. But even in this case, before it may seem, the mischief can be arrested, the loss repaired.
