How Paper Stood the Fire is chloride of lime about the floor.

By the seventh section of the act of Congrees making appropriations for the Indian Department, approved May 29th, 1672, it is enseted, That it shall be the buty of the Secretary of the Interior to prepare and cause to be published, such rules and regulations as he may deem neessary or proper, prescribing the manner of presenting claims arising under existing laws or treaty stipulations, for com sensation for depredations committed by he Indians, and the degree and characte of the evidence necessary to support and dalms; he shall carefully investigate all such claims as may be presented, subject to the rules and regulations prepared by him, and report to Congress at each one ion thereof, the nature, character, and mount of such claims, whether allowed by him or not, and the evidence upon which his action was based; provided That no payment on account of said claim shall be made without a specific appro printion by Congress.

Rules and Regulatiods are prescribed :

1. Application for indemnity or satisfaction for the loss or injury sustained, must be made by the claimant, his attorney or duly authorized agent, within three years after the commission of the depredation or injury, to the United States Superin-

2. The necessary documents and proofs must accompany the application of the claimant, his atterney or agent, and should be in legal form and consist,




