THE WAN DEPARTMENT REPORTS.

REPORT OF THE POSTNISTER GENERAL. The annual report of Postmaster General Cresswell, will show a larger increase in the business and each receipts of the department during the past year. The development of the postal service, at home and international, during the last ten years, has been enormous. THE PATENT OFFICE REPORT. Like most of the annual reports for the fiscal year, that of the Patent Office judinates a large increase of business. The most setounding fact however is that during the last décade the annual issue of patents and the general business of the office has been more than quadrupled. For example, ten years ago, the annual issue of patents was between three and four thousand. During the last fiscal year the number of patents issued amounted to 13.620. Since the Patent Laws have been modified, so as to place fereigners on an equality with American citizens, is obtaining patents and transacting busisees with the office, the number of foreign pplications for patents has increased. But the main cause of the enormous inrease of business is attributed to the rapd expansion of the manufacturing intersets of the country, and the general demand for new and improved machinery. The office is self-enstaining by the patent fees, which are quite low, and from the surplus of past years the Commissioner has turned ever nearly a million of dellars into the United States Treasury.


