"ANOTHER GREAT INVENTION.-A patent Knob Noster, Mo., fer an agricultural impliment which, with two horses, will break up eight acres of ground per day, to the depth of six inches. At the same time that the ground is broken it can, with this machine, be planted in corn or cane; or drilled in wheat, rye, oats and barley, with exact precision, all without change, save a slight regulation. With a slight change the cultivator can go on until the crop is made, the tillage being perfect. By simple attachments, the machine adds a fine reaper, and a cornharvester or mower. The implement is specially adapted to the cultivation of comparatively cheap. 


