Notes from Washington.
THE GROWTH AND EXPANSION OF
MANUFACTURES IN THE UNITED
STATES.

The annual reports from the heads of Departments, recently made to Congress, for the fiscal year, ending June 30, 1872, indicate a most extraordinary development of manufacturing industries, agriculture and internal trade.

In the South there has been a marked expansion of the iron and steel industry of the late war. The wide waste caused by that protracted strife, has been repaired. The railroads have been rebuilt, and new lines constructed; and the transportation facilities of that section of the country are better now than ever before.

The cotton crop of last year was equalled only once before in the history of the country, while that of the present year, according to the Agricultural Department, is ten per cent larger, and in the same proportion of better quality, than that of last year. In other staple products the increase has more than kept pace with that of cotton.

In the West the last and the present year are marked as years of general prosperity, and the crops of that vast region have suggested the exports of agricultural products far beyond the limits of any former period.

From Florida also, and the other States, the yield of wheat is so good that it is almost impossible to procure the hundreds of thousands of bushels of surplus to home use, and for export. The manufacture of wine has also become an important industry, and promises a great future in that of France. The cultivation of tea has been quite largely introduced and is found to promise the most profitable results, as also the cultivation of the silk worm and manufacture of silk.

In the Eastern States general prosperity is reported of almost every branch of industry. The manufacturing years past, in fact since the close of the war, have been barely able to keep up with the demand for goods. The trade circles, generally reliable, state that the cotton will this year consume three per cent more cotton than last, and this is about the average of a year's consumption in the last five years. During the last fiscal year 20,000,000 yards of cloth were produced, and it is estimated that the full extent of the woolen manufacturing is also increasing their facilities and this year they will consume a lot of sheep per cent more raw material than in 1871.

The foreign trade of the fiscal year has been the largest in the history of the country, the exports of goods amounting to \$1,000,000,000. The increase of foreign trade has kept pace with that of other industries; but now the ship yards are busy again, and the iron works are that this year's exception in the general progress will not be marred by a rapid increase of wood and iron tonnage.

land and Massachusetts are five of manufacturing industry, their annual products approaching in value \$400,000,000. It is stated by statistical writers in these general States that seventy five per cent, of the present owners of these manufacturing plants started a few years ago, at practical weekly wages. They are not only now at the head of the establishments, but are the owners of over fifty per cent of the capital invested in these works.
