Panama Canal Mistake? WASHINGTON-America's decision to relinquish control of the Panama Canal could not come
time for the conduct of our foreign affairs. It represents a sharp departure for a country known or its resolve in world affairs and will no doubt be met in other froots. In and of itself, the Panama Canal decision represents a serious foreign policy mistake. The Canal is a vita ommercial and naval waterway, important to our eco-
nomic well-being and to that of the world. Its national security importance to this country is above dispute. Provisions added to the treaty which proponents argue
