[GENERAL NATURE-No. 13.] AN ACT to authorize the examination of

certain banks, Be it enacted by the Senate House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled. That the Comptroller of the Currency, in addition to the powers now conferred upon him by law for the examination of national banks, is hereby further authorized, when ever he may deem it useful, to cause ax amination to be made into the sendifier of any bank in the District of Columbia organized under act of Congress. The Comptraller, at his discretion, may report to Congress the results of such examination.
