EAGLE PASS, TEXAS, June 26, 1873. Editors State Journal:

The following news arrived here to-day "On the 22nd instant a scout numbering 40 men of the Fourth U. S. Cavalry was ordered out from Camp Shafter, situated about 30 miles in a southeastly direction from here, commanded by Lieut, Thereton and guided by our "border chief."
