



How to make a Mustard Plas-

How many people are there who reali bublished at Lawrence, Kansas, one in abundred, at the most, perhaps, and yet mustard plasters are used in every family, and physicians prescribe their application, never telling anybody how to make them for the simple reason that the doctors themselves do not know, as a rule.

The ordinary way is to mix the mustare with water, tempering it with a little flou-er, but such a plaster as that makes is simply abominable. Before it has half done alimply abominable. Before it has half-flone its work it begins to blister the patient, and leaves him finally with a painful, flayed appet, after having produced far less of feet in a beneficial way than was intended.

Now a mustard plaster should never make a blister at all. If a blister is wanted, there are other pinaters far bester than mustard for the purpose. 




