The Austrian Women

During the afternoon the streets were literally massed with people, the women being all dressed very nearly alike. They had their heads tied up in heavy black silk scarfs or handkerchiefs, the two stiff ends floating like black wings behind them. The hair was entirely concealed, and the only ornaments worn were heavy gold earrings and

breastpins. They all wore eithers black silk, satin or velvet coats, and some of them were either braided or trimmed-with lace. This is the national costume, and is strictly adhered to in all this section of Austria. It seemed singular to see vonthful and handsome faces peering out from this gloomy head gear, and bright laughing eyes sparkling between the solemn black wings. The young men were all dressed like their fathers, black velvet vests with silver buttons being a distin-guishing feature of their costume. This annual gathering in the streets of Hall on the festival of Corpus Christi is one upon which fathers and mothers arrange for the mar-

riage of their sons and daughters, and there is a great deal of matchmaking prefected under the groves lining the main streets of the town. 
