The pupils of Reynolds' Grammar School Philadelphia, publish a monthly, called *Our Students Record*, which gives the following selections from boys' compositions:  
"I hope I may live and see a very prosperous life and I hope when I am old the children will be kind to me; but whatever my lot is, I ought to be contented. I think I will get married once, but if she should die, I think I would never get married again, and go out fishing, and have cows, pigs, sheep, chickens, and have plenty of pork and some mutton."  
"I would like to be a Senator or Governor, or one of the members of Parliament or a good Judge, or a tax collector; I would like to be a President, because he is always doing something in the form of law and vetoing the U. S. bills presented. I don't want to be a fisherman or a sailor; People think when they are near a harbor they are safe; but I wouldn't say I was safe on board of a vessel till I was on ground."  
"When I am a man, that is if God will spare my life, I would like to be a farmer. If you are going to be a farmer you cannot see all your old companions, and the young ladies that you knew when you were a young man. I guess it must be fine to be a father, for when you can whip your children whenever you want to, only when they get too big."  
"I hope I will be a rich man, but I don't think I will ever be poor, and if I have luck enough to be very rich, I will be one of the biggest sports in Pennsylvania, and will wear the finest clothes in the city, and will wear every style of men's clothes there is, and have a gold watch with a diamond face and all kinds of gold chains, and have the fastest race horses there are, and drive through the park with a ten-horse team with one seat. I will live in a pretty marble mansion, and will have a short life and a merry one, but will never take intoxicating liquors of any kind."  
"When I am a man I want to be peaceable; I don't want my creditors after me all the time. I want a pleasant home and good children; I hope they will be better than I am now—that speaks bad for me. I won't play cricket or go to school any more, but what is worse I will be bothered with business; but if I am an old bachelor I won't have any pleasures, but different kinds of troubles."  
"If ever I become a man perhaps I might be President of the United States, and then I would be proud; and perhaps I might be rich as any one. Or when I am a man perhaps I might be a clerk in the Continental."  
"I would like to have about fifty men working for me, and if I am rich I will pay them good wages. If I own a farm I will have to be where the workmen are, and bossing them; nothing can be more disagreeable than a man bossing another man."  
"I would like to be boss over some lads when I am about twenty-five, and then I will make them jump around. I would like to be a rich man, and own about a dozen houses, and I will live in the best one, and take the worst one for a livery stable."  
"General Lee was a good boy and grew to be a wise man. My brother was better; he grew up a good man. When I grow up to be a man I will never get drunk and never smoke or chew tobacco."  
"I hope I will never learn to drink, or chew tobacco, or any other bad habit. I am going to learn hard and get in the High School, so that I'll be smart when I get to be a man. I don't want to be like some stupid men, I want to try to be a merchant. I would like to save up and go to China."  
"For my part when I am a man, I'd like to go among girls and take them to balls and parties. I would go to ladies houses and pass the evening away, and go walking here and there, and then when I was old I would know what I was about."  
"When I am a man I will do my Christian duties and read Bible. I would like to go fishing in a boat sometimes, when the weather is pleasant. I would like to have a mission school and teach the poor to love God and be Christians. I would like to be a good man and boy all my life. I would like to join church and not use profane language."  
"I would like to spend my time in professional base ball playing, gunning, fishing, swimming and boating. I would like to live in the mountains, but I would like to skeddadle when an earthquake or something like that would come."  
"When I am a man I never in-

ted to go into a beer saloon, because, you know, I don't drink beer; or into a tobacco store, because it would make me sick to stay there a day."  
"When I am a man I would like to be President of the United States and have a pair of beautiful horses and a beautiful wife. I would like to be a carpenter if I could not be President."  
"I would like to have a wife and I hope I will have a good education. When I am a man I think I will go to church and I would like to have a good deal of money."  
"I would like to be kind to the poor and needy, by giving them food and fuel during the cold blasts of winter. I would like to go on a tour throughout the world and send missionaries to heathen countries. When I am a man I never want to use tobacco or drink any kind of spirits."  
The above are, without alteration, taken from exercises recently handed in by some of our rising generation. They are curious as literary specimens; interesting, as showing the bent of the masculine mind, and touching, as giving some glimpses of real life.

**A Millionaire Thief Finding a Refuge in New York.**  
Among the great failures during the recent financial crash in Vienna was that of the so-called Vienna Association, an institution which had a nominal capital of 100,000,000 florins. Its manager was a young Austrian financier named Rudolph Pokorny, who received an annual salary of 20,000 florins, and who was considered one of the ablest financiers in the Austrian capital. Pokorny was a bachelor, and his habits were looked upon as an exceptionable, except that he lived with a young American widow named Annie Lee, to whom he seemed to be greatly attached. He intended to marry her, for on the 19th of April last the bans of his engagement with her were publicly proclaimed from the pulpit of St. Stephen's Church. Shortly after the opening of the Universal Exhibition the financial affairs of Vienna were found to be in a very rotten condition. Banking houses after banking houses went down, and even the best accredited institutions were looked upon with suspicion. Only the Credit Association, with its vast capital, escaped disaster. To it were carried deposits, when they were withdrawn everywhere else, until the 21st of May, when the directors of the bank found, to their dismay that their treasuries cashier had fled. He had left behind him the following significant note:  
"The cash account is short 9,000,000 florins. The fault is not mine exclusively. You can make up for it. I am tired of working for such men, and go to another world."  
RUDOLPH POKORNY.  
The consternated directors sent detectives after him, but without success, and on May 26 the following notice was posted at the door of the Credit Association:  
"Rudolph Pokorny, our dishonest cashier, is now undoubtedly on his way to New York. As far as we can judge now, he has stolen from us 1,000,000 florins. Steps have been taken to secure his arrest."


**Thoughts by Josh Billings.**

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

LOCAL AFFAIRS.

ALEX. E. SWEET, Notary Public, Express Office. The Sheriff of Mason County has lodged three horse thieves in the jail at Frederickburg.

A BOOT-BLACK has made his appearance on the streets, but did not seem to do a very thriving business.

The translation of an article replying to the National Republican taken from our German contemporary will be read with interest.

PERSONALS.—Dr. Herf has returned from Boerne. Judge Devine has got back from Helena.

A black man named Gray was fined for punneling another colored voter. He thought the Recorder ought to let him off because the man was a bosom friend of his.

The Tigress has sailed in search of the Polar, but it is not believed that anything will be accomplished this year beyond lying up at some safe point, as the season is so far advanced.

JAN. H. FRENCH does not keep his fashionable furnishing store opposite the Bank as much as he used to. He has removed to the store adjoining Mr. Bell, where he will doubtless share the fate of all those who furnish first class goods at moderate prices.

We are informed that the donation of a portion of Bexar County to Medina County made by the last Legislature was a put up job between Ireland and some would-be Democrats of that section. Quite a number signed a paper to the effect that they would vote the Democratic ticket at the next election as a part of the consideration.

MAD DOGS.—The Mayor has pronounced against mad dogs the campaign to begin at once. All dogs not muzzled or tied up will be shot.

We have conversed with several old citizens, who have been in Texas for over 30 years, and we have not found one who ever saw a mad dog or other animal afflicted with hydrophobia. It is true that there are numerous instances of dogs running through the streets of different cities biting all the dogs they came across, but as for hydrophobia resulting from we have yet to hear of an instance. It has been decided by experience in large cities that the most effective way of making a dog mad is to put a muzzle on him in hot weather. Hence we may look for lively skirmishing. Life Insurance Companies will be apt to lose money before this thing is over.

A GENTLEMAN recently from Fort Hill reports that the Commanders are out on a little hunt. Like the man who fell into the mud hole one dark night, we know it for ourselves now. We don't wish to be captious or to bury them up at all, but they should get through scalping before next October when that conference is to take place.

We are informed that the Kioways, who had not completed their arrangements to compete with the Comanches in the Texas scalp line, are very angry that Sautanta and Big Tree are not released. So are the people of Texas that they are not hung.

We wonder if the Quakers weep any because the Kioways are not getting their share of Texas hair.

It reminds us of the little boy who wept over the picture of "Daniel in the lion's den." His mother thought he wept for Daniel, but it turned out that he wept for "that poor little lion in the corner that won't be in time to get a bite."

OUR CITY AFFAIRS.—We have always believed that our municipal corporation had as legal authority to expend the money of the city for convivial occasions. If the city administration has the power to give a reception to one man, why has it not to do the same to anybody it may choose to admit. Here is a broad door opened to fraud. Say for instance that the City Council in a lucid interval were to purchase of Noyes his two pitch ing mules for \$5000.00, and insist that the mounted Ditch Commissioners and other officials ride them until there was a little rotation in office. But they might go further and get up a magnificent reception for some such representative man as John Ireland. They could do so with the same authority that the Balknap and Sheridan expenses were paid.

But to be serious, about it. This point has been decided in four different States, and the decisions are uniform and conclusive that no municipal corporation has the power to appropriate the money raised by taxation to such purposes. In the case of Hood vs. Lyon—let Allen Reports, and in another similar case in the 2nd Conn. Reports it has been decided that a town had no authority even to appropriate money to celebrate the 4th of July. Money raised by taxes can only be applied to the purposes for which they are levied, viz: for the promotion of the health, convenience or protecting the rights of the citizens.

As to fixing the responsibility for the repayment of the money we have not time to elaborate.

Our city is virtually bankrupt. A great but unsuccessful effort was made last week to raise money on these proposed bonds, but the probability of 15 months more of mismanagement and extravagance kills negotiations. Those who danced so gaily last January will pay the piper for their merriment before they get rid of him.

Army News. Capt. C. N. W. Cunningham, 24th Infantry, relieved from duty as member of the General Court Martial instituted by Special Orders No. 112, current series, from these Headquarters, and Capt. W. O'Connell, 4th Cavalry, is appointed in his stead. Acting Assistant Surgeon J. A. Wolf, U. S. Army, is relieved from duty at Fort Richardson, Texas, and will proceed to Fort McKavett, Texas, and report to the commanding officer and post surgeon for duty.

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
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
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
