[From the Boston Post;] Unheard of Horrors in a Lunatic Asylum.

A most horrible and almost inredible condition of affairs in the Vermont Insane Asylum is describ-ed in the report of the legislative committee appointed to investigate the management of that institution. The committee's first discovery was that the asylum, which is controlled by a private coropration, was greatly over-growded, 485 patients being packed into a space intended to accommodate but 300 at the most.
