Sitting for a Photograph.

Having a photograph taken is one of the great events of a man's life. The chief desire is to look the very best, and on the success of the picture hinges, in many cases, the most important epochs in life. To work up a proper appearance time enough is used which, if devoted to catching fish for their phosphores, would cancel the entire national debt and establish a New York daily paper. When you have completed your toilet you go to the gallery and force yourself into a nonchalant expression that is too absurd for anything. Then you take their chair, spread your legs carefully, appropriate a calm and very indifferent look, and commence to breathe. Then he runs his hand through your hair and scratches your scalp and steps back to the camera and the injured velvet for another look. By this time new sweat and pomade have started out. The whites of your eyes show unpleasantly, and your whole body feels as if it had been visited by an enormous cramp, and another and much bigger one was momentarily expected. Unheard of Horrors in a Lunatic Asylum.

A most horrible and almost incredible condition of affairs, in the Vermont Insane Asylum is described in the report of the legislative committee appointed to investigate the management of that institution. The committee's first discovery was that the asylum, which is controlled by a private corporation, was greatly over-crowded, 485 patients being packed into a space intended to accommodate but 300 at the most. This, however, is a trifling matter in comparison with other revelations. Seventy-five of these unfortunate were thrust way in subterranean dungeons, dark, damp, foul, and pervaded by unendurable stenches. Some were confined in apartments nine feet by four in size, with air and ventilation only through auger holes bored in the doors. The active as well as the passive inflictions put upon these poor people, proved equally inhuman. Among them was the punishment of the bath, in which the patient, securely bound, is placed in a bathing tub and a continuous stream of cold water allowed to fall upon his head. This torture, it may be remarked in passing, was one of the most execrating known in the dark ages, resulting usually in insanity or death. To this asylum of horrors the committee also state that some men have been consigned through fraud and bribery. The picture is as complete as Charles Reade could make it, but without the romance of fiction. The reality is something for the legislature of Vermont to deal with promptly and severely; for it is too disgraceful for belief, except as attested by an official investigation such as has produced this astounding report.

Editor San Antonio Express:

"Here while soft breezes lull us, blowing lowly" we seat ourself at the foot of a tree and jot down a few thoughts for the benefit of a large portion of visitors to Texas who may be classed under the head of valetudinarians.

Impressio, Boerne, itself, is a small but thriving town, thirty miles from San Antonio. It contains several good blacksmith shops, taverns, &c., which usually are found in a village. *Faciess decessus savoris!* which freely translated means its easy to find a taxer!

Our hostess, Mme. Staffel has everything necessary to make visitors comfortable. She is clear, pure, fresh, invigorating, healthy and life-giving air in these hills is enough in itself to make an octogenarian feel like throwing stones at his grand-mother; old people who come here infirm, weak, sick, tired of life, and it's ill, get so frisky that their neighbors have to knock 'em down and sit on 'em to keep them from climbing the telegraph poles and walking the wires with their eyes-lashes, in the exuberance of their happiness. In the season game is abundant. Many "city folk" come here and all leave reluctantly.

The air makes one very drowsy and we have slept on an average about half the time. Our appetite no doubt makes Mme. Staffel think we have some particular spite against the corn contractors and that we were trying to "get up a corner" by consuming the entire crop.

The crops look well. Grass is fine, water-plenty. Horses and cattle seem to have found an Arcadia in these valleys, they look sleek, fat, and seem to be in prime condition.

While San Antonio is melting with the almost tropical heat, Boerne enjoys cool, brisk breezes that make one loth to go into the house at all.

A friend of ours who left San Antonio ten days ago says he has already gained five pounds! We will keep him here a month or two, and then send him to Barnum.

Dr. Herff and family left three days ago after spending a fortnight here. We have no doubt he will verify our description in its main features but he must not tell any one that there are no telegraph poles here, it would ruin our reputation for veracity.

The author therefore, recommends as a safe and sure preventive, the employment first of vaccine, and afterward inoculation, the purpose of the vaccination being to remove the danger that might otherwise attend the introduction of the small-pox virus.
