[From the Science of Health.] Signs of Madness in Dogs.

The British "Medical Journal calls attention to the measures recommended by the Council of Hygiene of Bordeaux for the better protection of the people against the dangers of hydrophobia. It is well understood that the madness of dogs has a period which is premon-itory and harmless. It these periods were generally known, the dogs could be put out of the way before they become dangerous. On this subject the Council of Hygiene has issued the following instructions :

A short time, sometimes two days, after madness has seized a dog, it creates symptoms in the animal which it is indispensable to re-

1. There is agitation and restlessness, and the dog turns himself continually in his kennel. If he beat liberty, he goes and comes and seems to be seeking something, when he remains motionless, as if waiting ; then starts, bites the air as if he would catch a fly, and dashes himself howling and barking against the wall. The voice of his master dissipates these ballucinations; the dog obeys, but slowly-


