Summer Diet for Infants.

At a recent meeting of the public health association of New York, a series of resolutions were passed requesting Dr. A. Jacobi to furnish for the use of the association a shedule of directions concerning infantile diet in summer, and to present the same at a future meeting. Last evening, at the rooms of the Medical Journal association, Dr. Jacobi responded to the resolution, prefacing his remarks by an elabor ate address on the physiology of infant digestion and fool. Over-feeding does more harm than anything else; nurse a baby of a month old or two every two or three hours; nurse a babe of six months and over five times in 24

when a baby gets thirsty in the mean time, give it a drink of water or barley water. In very hot weather, mix a teaspoonful of whisky in a tumbler ful of water (no sugar).

Boil a teaspoon full of powdered barley (grind it in the coffee grinder) and a gill of water with salt for 15 minutes. Strain sta and mix it with half as much boiled milk and a piece of losf sugar. Give it luke warm, through a nursing

Keep a bottle and monthpless in

When babies are very costive, use oatmeal instead of barley, but be sure to cook and strain it. When your breast wilk is half enough for the infant, alternate with

bread and food. In hot summer weather dip small piece of litmas paper into the food before feeding. If the blue paper turns read and a pinch of baking soda to the food.

Babies of six months may have beet tee or beef soup once a day by itself or mixed with other food. Babies of 10 or 12 months may have a crust of bread and a plece of raw beatsteak to suck.

No child under 2 years should est from your table. The summer complaint comes from over-feeding and hot and foul air. Keep doors and windows open. Wash your children with cold wa-






