The last rail in the Texas and Pacific Railroad, connecting Shreveport with Dallas, the southern terminus of the Missouri, Kansas and Texas Railroad, was laid Tuesday. PROCEEDINGS of the Republican Mass-Meeting of Calhoun County, held at Indianola, August 2nd, 1873. Pursuant to a call made by the acting chairman of the Calhoun County Republican Committee the Republicans of said County assembled at the Court House in the City of Indianola on Saturday evening August 2nd, 1873 for the purpose of electing Delegates for the Dallas Convention.

The meeting was called to order by J. Wagner, Esq., and on motion Mr. G. W. Hartup was elected Chairman and Mr. N. M. McCrumb, Secretary of the meeting. Wm. Westhoff, Esq., moved that a committee of five be appointed to draft resolutions expressive of the sense of the meeting, adopted, and the chair appointed C. H. Frosty, R. W. Varnel, C. Kleinbeck, J. Nelson, and T. Wilson, who after a short absence reported the following resolutions which were unanimously adopted: Be it resolved by the Republicans of Calhoun County in Mass-Meeting assembled.

1. That the protection of life and property, and the education of all citizens is essential, and necessary for the welfare of a civilized State. 2. That we here reaffirm our adhesion to and confidence in the Republican party and declare ourselves a component part thereof; that we will give its principles and candidates our enthusiastic support, that we believe it the duty of every patriotic citizen of this country to unite and participate with us in maintaining the broad principles of Republicanism. 3. That we have full confidence in the wisdom, patriotism and honesty of Gov. E. J. Davis; that he is entitled to the same from the people of all parties; for the impartial and fearless manner in which he has administered the executive office. 4. That we fully endorse the opposition Gov. Davis has offered to the destructive work of the 15th Legislature which has an overwhelming majority, in repealing the Public Free Schools, thereby proving an enemy to the welfare of the people in Texas. 5. That the delegates from this county are hereby instructed to vote in the State Convention for the renomination of Gov. Davis as we believe he has not only the confidence of republicans all over the State, but the confidence of a large majority of the people aside from political opinions. 6. We are in favor of immigration into the State of Texas and we desire and require proper steps be taken by the State administration to promote the same.

7. That the proceedings of this meeting be published in the State Journal, Free Press, and San Antonio EXPRESS. The following named gentlemen were placed in nomination and unanimously elected as delegates to attend the Dallas Convention, viz: C. H. Frosty, G. W. Hartup, and J. Nelson. On motion the Convention adjourned sine die. C. W. HARTUP, Chairman. N. M. MCCRUMB, Secretary.
