Twenty seven of the signers had been regularly graduated in colleges, or about one half. Twenty others had received an academic education, and the received an academic education, and the remainder had or at home. Of the fifty six Signers twenty-five had studied the institutions of Great Britain while sojourning in that country. All had son thing to lose in the struggle should result in failure to them. 


