The German Convention.

In another column will be found the "Address of the German Convention to the German-American citizens of Texas."

Although not particularly in favor of the separate action of our own nationality in this country and State, which is the common home of all nations and peoples, we are struck with the soundness of the principles enunciated in the address.

The address sounds like an echo from the platform of the great American Republican party.

It is one of the triumphs of Republicanism that this eminently intelligent body of citizens can meet at all, and express their views without fear of molestation. But it is a still greater triumph for Republicanism to have brought it to pass that this address is favorably received by a majority of the people of Texas.

Would it have been safe for a German convention to have met and issued an address of that character if the Republican party had not shaken the life out of the Confederacy?

Does any person of intelligence imagine that such a convention would have been possible with a Democratic president at Washington, and a Bourbon Democrat for Governor at Austin?

The re-election of Grant has compelled the worst element of the Democracy to another resentment, while those who think, are convinced of the justice of the demands of the Republican party, that the rights of every man must and shall be respected.

Of course, we have a great deal of twaddle from the Democratic press about this having been the doctrine of the Democracy *ab initio*, in spite of the fact that the last Legislature did all in its power to make the foreigner a *pariah*, instead of a citizen and in spite of the fact that it has hopelessly crippled immigration.

The Democratic press endeavor to make out that there is no danger of the enforcement of temperance laws in Texas, in the face of the fact that the last Legislature had the matter under serious consideration and the additional circumstance that there are nearly 40,000 enrolled voters of temperance in Texas.

The German Convention is in favor of an effective protection of life and property.

The Democratic press with its columns filled like a graveyard, with accounts of mob law and private assassination warlike demerely: "That has always been Democratic doctrine."

The German Convention is in favor of free schools.

"That is the corner stone of the Democracy" warble these Democratic impostors on the mendacity of States.

"No special legislation that can be provided for by general enactments" says the German Convention.

"This can only be accomplished by a Democratic Legislature" says the Democratic press with the record of the 15th Democratic Legislature before them, on which we stand, by him that runs, that two thirds of the precious time of the 15th was taken up passing special bills which could all have been disposed of by a general law.

"We declare against repudiation in any form" says the German Convention.

"We are in union with the Southern in this point" says the

Democracy, in the face of the fact that the foremost organs of the party are compelled to admit the truth that the last Legislature did unconstitutionally repudiate its solemn obligations to the International railroad.

The German Convention favors reasonable State aid towards immigration. This too is found by the Democratic press to have been one of the planks in the Democratic platform, as if every German in the country did not know exactly what took the Democratic Legislature to the "immigration question," and so on to the end of the chapter.

The people of Texas can not be deceived by this Democratic requirement in every good idea, that is advanced by men who have no part or parcel with them.

It is a shallow device to attempt to breathe into the loathsome corpse of Democracy, the spirit of Jefferson, the abolitionist, and of other great men, who could not possibly have had anything in common with the teachings of the Texas Democracy.

Nobody cares a row of pins what the theory of the Democracy is or was. The last Legislature is what they look to as a test. It has increased the taxes, favored repudiation, repudiated life and property insurance, and virtually destroyed the free schools.

The Germans know this, and will be very apt to act accordingly.

Address of the German Convention.

To the German-American citizens of Texas:

In pursuance of a published call for a convention of the German speaking citizens, we, delegates to the convention and citizens of this country, have assembled for a free discussion of the best interests of the State, and because we desire to secure special immunities, or separation from other classes of the body politic, but solely because our native language facilitates the understanding and discussion of the object we desire to further, and because the imperfect knowledge of the English language renders it impossible for us to make our wishes heard and understood in general conventions.

These reasons should satisfy all fair thinking people. We have declared, and will again repeat that the idea of forming a new party is far from all of us. On the contrary, we desire by a public declaration of our political views, to further a harmonious co-operation with all nationalities united by the strong bond of American citizenship.

We demand nothing for ourselves, and have in view only the well being of all, our regulations refer (relate) only to the inalienable rights of all citizens of the State: protection of life and property, the education of the youth, a rational system of taxation, the selection of honest men for office, and the security of personal and civil liberty.

We submit these resolutions to you in order that you may consider and more fully recognize them in your local organizations, and we recommend that in the coming elections, you make it conditional that the candidates soliciting your votes support your principles.

We in convention assembled, Germans, have not met in our capacity of citizens of the country, to discuss the political condition of the State. We do this because the German language, understood by us all, facilitates a better understanding, and because we, as a minority, in the convention fall to obtain the proper expression of our views (opinions), we therefore recommend the following principles to our German-American citizens for their guidance in their political conduct:

1. We demand a liberal system of free schools, that will meet the reasonable demand of all citizens.

2. We demand effective (sufficient) protection of the lives and property of all the inhabitants of the State.

3. We declare against all special legislation that can be provided for by general enactments.

4. We declare against repudiation in any form.

5. We favor reasonable State aid towards immigration.

6. In the nomination of candidates for office and in the filling of offices, we demand as the sole rule, capacity and rectitude.

7. We declare against the passage of any law, whether tending to oppress any class of the inhabitants of the State, on account of race or nationality.

8. We declare against any restrictions of the personal liberty of the citizens, and particularly against all Sunday and temperance laws.

9. The burden of taxation must be equally divided, without opposing special legitimate occupations. The taxes to be applied to the real necessities of the State and community only, and to the payment of the public debt.

Believing it to be the duty of every citizen to take an active part in politics, and to sustain his principles at the ballot box, we respectfully call your attention to the necessity of a speedy registration of the voters, and earnestly advise the forming of regular local organizations, and we hope that this step to unite the German speaking citizens may have the desired effect for the well being of our State at large.

Latest News.

New York, Aug. 11.—Last night in Williamsburg, Wm. Anderson, instigated by jealousy and whiskey, stabbed Annie Cunningham in the back four or five times with a common jack-knife, and then stabbed himself three times in the left side. Neither of them are fatally injured.

Last night in Brooklyn, Michael Savage fell from a store, and owing to his great age his recovery from injuries is doubtful. His wife was shocked at the occurrence she died in a few hours.

Gen. Smith and Major Bennett of Minnesota, had two interviews at Long Branch with the President about the Manitoba affair. They explained the whole matter, dwelling especially on the cruelty of prisoners that are treated by Manitoba authorities. They also sought to impress on the President, the necessity for a speedy action as they feared the people of Minnesota would take the settlement of the case in their own hands unless something was done at once. The President, according to a dispatch, gave them to understand that unless the matter was disposed of within reasonable time, the demand in unmistakable terms would be made on the British Government, and would be followed by further action. The President then asked the Governor and Major to reduce the statement of writing, which they did, and the paper was forwarded to Ley Fish, who will be visited to-day by its authors.

A Herald special from Valencia says troops to the surrender of 10,000 troops, concentrated before the city under the command of Martinez, Capoue, Salcedo, Valencia and Villacava, and with 18 siege cannons in position. Junta proposed to surrender the city on condition that the commanders of the troops guaranteed a full pardon to all insurgents, and expressed an appreciation that the Insurgents were not the city if these terms were not conceded to. This proposition was made on the 6th, the same day the stamped from the city occurred.
