HOUSTON, Aug. 13, 1873. The dull season in Houston has been temporarily enlivened by the exciting proceedings of the Repubfriend and benefactor, J. G. Tracy. It has been for some time no secret that Postmaster Whittlesey, in con-junction with Cols. Gillespie and Parker, were preparing to dispute with Senator Tracy the leadership of the party, and the meetings of the Convention have been water with keen interest by all civic poli-ticians. The colored troops were summoned to the sid of their tried sewer, and with the first bycket of leader, Richard Allen, and the mud brought up a bundle of papers. colonels gathered a no inconsiderable army of city and railroad laborers round their standard.

Saturday was spent in skirmish ing, in which the Tracyites had some advantage, but the final engagement was delayed until Monday. The first noteworthy event of that evening was a skillful strategic movement executed by A. B. Hall, Esq. 
