The Great Journalist of Russia

The Russian Empire has hitherto produced but one great journalist. But he is a truly eminent manstair-cases. &c., and promise prompt at-tention and low prices. (2-3.73d6m of the world, even in those countries where journalism is by far more developed than in the land of the ezars, may be justly proud. His name is Gregory Sandos Katkoff; and be is still a comparatively young man. He is editor and pro prietor of the Moscow Gazette, a journal which has obtained the, for Russia, upprecedented daily eirculation of eighty thousand copies, and the so-called Old Russian or National party regards him as its most eminent representative. In the event of a political revolution in Russia, M. Katkoff would be certain to play a most conspicuous

part in the history of his country. Under the circumstances, we behere the following account of an interview with this remakable man, man, translated from the Moscow correspondence of the Baltic Gazette. (Ost-See-Zeitung,) will be read with

interest ; "Yesterday I saw Mr. Katkoff at his office on the Nishny Serak. I doubt if there is in all Europe a more sumptnously fitted up editorial sanctum than his. Everything there, he told me, had been made in imitation of the great American newspaper establishments, of which Mr. Katkoff is an ardent admirer. There is a library of ten thousand volumes; speaking tubes leading to every part of the vast building; the cosiest little rooms for the assistant editors and reporters; a

sanctum, rose from his easy chair, and, upon learning who I was, cordially shook hands with me.

"'Your paper has often denounced me bitterly,' he said, smilingly, but I like it very much after all You see, I said, 'you are the most conspictious adversary of the German party in Russia, and so you must stand the blows leveled at your whole party.' You do me too much honor, replied Mr. Katkoff, 'I do not know that I deserve it. I am nothing but a journalist.' He then alluded to the difficulties with which he had to contend when establishing his great journal, and said to me:

"You will hardly believe me when I tell you that at first it was almost impossible for me, no matter how hard I tried, to write snything fit to be printed. We published in 1862 our first weekly issue. It contained two brief editorials, and I believe, before I sent the manu scripts to the printer, I rewrote the articles a dozen times; and I await ed with painful anxiety the appearance of the paper. Our success was at first little better than failure. Of our first issue we sold only 300 copies. This discouraging result I ascribed to my own incapacity for the journalistic profession, and hence I felt strongly temped to

abandon the whole undertaking. "But my young wife urged me to try again. She assured me my articles were by no means bad; and so, perhaps, more to gratify her than because I cared soyself to write, I did try again. I wrote an article on the trescherous and imbecile foreign policy of the Austrian Emperor. I abused him roundly in terse Enssian; and we actually sold in consequence 8000 copies of the Gazette. 


