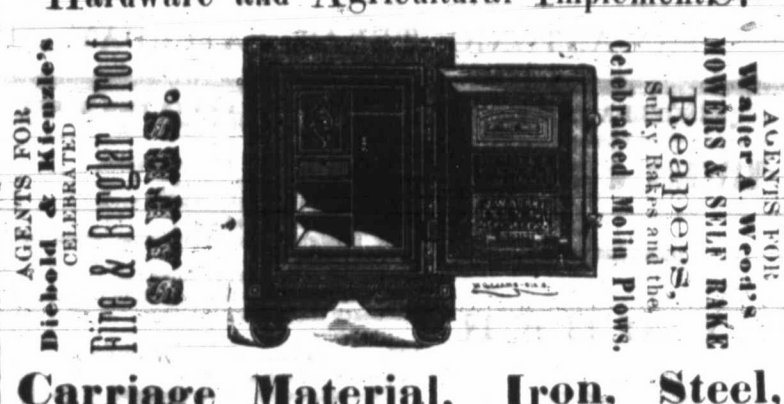

SPECIAL ELECTION! The petition of more than fifty freeholders of the County of Bexar presented to the County Court for an election to take the opinion of the electors of said County on a proposition that said County shall aid in the construction of the Galveston-Harrisburg and San Antonio Railroad, according to the terms and conditions of the proposal submitted by the committee of citizens of said County to T. W. Pearce, President of said Road and accepted by him, which proposal is substantially as follows: It is proposed to pay said Company Five hundred thousand dollars in the Bonds of Bexar County, payable in thirty (30) years, bearing eight (8) per cent interest per annum, with yearly coupons attached, on condition that said Company will build and equip and run said road from Columbus, Texas, to within not more than one and one-half miles of the Main Plaza in the city of San Antonio, on the most direct and practicable route to be determined by the Chief Engineer of said Company, within twenty (20) months from the time of the promulgation of the order that two-thirds of the qualified voters of said Bexar County has been given in favor of the proposal.
