**French Literature.**  
There is in general so much ignorance and presumption displayed in the views of France published in this country, that we experience genuine pleasure in finding that she has enlightened vindicators even here. We eagerly avail ourselves of the rare instance before us. The Cincinnati Enquirer which is but the echo of a goodly number of German and American Journals, had published the following:  
"The literature of the French is inferior to that of the English and German, and we do not believe that the French Shakespeare, or Goethe?"  
We do not take it upon ourselves to refute this pretentious criticism. The Cincinnati Times replies as follows:  
Very fine indeed! When we consider the fact that the English had no literature at all, until France sent them the seeds with the Norman invasion; that the language even in which they write is more French than Saxon, and that the first veritable burst of English literature and art commencing in the reign of the Black Prince, was but a copy—and a minute copy—of French authors and artists. The comparison so flattering to German letters seems rather ridiculous, when we reflect that the literature of that country is the most modern of civilized Europe and dates back but a few generations.  
The combined literatures of the whole world produce no such brilliant array of names as that of France. A literature whose splendor dazzles not only by direct influence, but by the light it sheds on the letters of other nations. To cite a few notable instances: Where will we find more extensively believed and displaying bolder imagination or works of better design and finish than those of the Trojans and the Trobadores of the eleventh and twelfth centuries—a period at which Germany and England were as devoid of literature as chaos was of light? The late *romance of the langue d'oïl* have no rivals in the poetry of the middle ages. In epic poetry too, France preceded other modern nations by several centuries, witness "Histoires de priant de Troye," written by St. Maure in 1100, and the "Roman d'Alexandre" by du Cors in 1180. Prose history also appeared there much earlier than with contemporaneous nations for their brilliant "Chronique de la conquête de Constantinople" was written by Villehardouin in 1207. The "Memoirs" by Joinville of the good Louis IX, remain to this day almost without biographical parallel for their undecaying simplicity of recital, and the "Chroniques" of Froissart have been for five entire centuries the dictionary of historians and romancers.  
Turning to the religious and literary revival of the sixteenth century, we find the names of Rabelais, Montaigne, Amyot, Marot, Ronsard, Malherbe, Vouture and the great Calvin. A century later we encounter an august genius ever ready to confront the immortal fame of Shakespeare and Goethe—Pierre Corneille, the first, the great tragic writer that the world ever produced. Around him gleams like an aureole of glory the brilliant logic of Descartes, the vehement eloquence of Pascal, the sacred and pathetic orator of Bossuet, the artistic style of Flecheier, the incomparable sermons of Bourdaloue and Massillon. Tragedy refines itself into new channels with Moliere, and fable flourishes with La Fontaine. Shades of the Muse—what names press forward, after stars of the literary firmament, before which the genius of the rest of Europe shines with dim lustre. Fenelon, La Rochefoucauld, La Bruyere, Vertot, Fenry, Cardinal de Lotz, Madame de Sevigny, Maistrebranche. Turn another chronological leaf and behold another cluster of brilliant suns, the giant philosophers of the eighteenth century, whose names re-echo throughout the centuries: Montesquieu, Voltaire, Rousseau, Buffon. These were the great masters and among their numerous disciples, many are nearly as great as they, Diderot, d'Alembert, d'Holbach, Condillac, Condorcet, Crevillon, Le Sage, Jean-Jacques, Chateaubriand, de Stael. Passing to another era, we greet Lamartine, Hugo de Vigny, Scrive, George Sand, Balzac, Soult, Karr, Beranger, de Musset. We finally reach the great and incomparable critical and historical cycle which gives us Quinot, Taine, Thierry, Simondon, Michelet, Martin, Lithe, Thiers, Miguet, Louis Blanc.

Inferior to English and German literature forsooth. These examples which France perhaps surpasses not, but her complete catalogue is as superior to theirs, as the talents of a cultivated woman of society are to those of a mere school girl.

**PROCLAMATION**  
By the Governor of the State of Texas.  
To all to whom these presents shall come:  
WHEREAS, The Legislature of the State of Texas by a joint resolution passed June 4th, 1873, has proposed certain amendments to the Constitution of the State, which said resolution reads as follows, viz: Joint resolution proposing amendments to section twenty of article one, Bill of Rights, to section two, section three and section four of article five, section twenty-eight, section forty and to section forty-eight of article five of the Constitution of the State of Texas, which said resolution reads as follows to-wit:  
Sec. 20. No power of suspending laws in the State shall be exercised except by the Legislature.  
Sec. 2. That section 2, section 3 and section 4 of article 5 of the said Constitution be so amended as to hereafter read as follows, to-wit: Section 2. The Supreme Court shall consist of one Chief Justice and four Associate Justices, any three of whom shall constitute a quorum. They shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate for a term of nine years. All vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term. If a vacancy shall occur, or a term shall expire while the Senate is not in session, the Governor shall fill the same by appointment, which shall be sent to the Senate within ten days after the body shall assemble, and the same shall take office within immediately thereafter.  
Sec. 3. The Supreme Court shall have appellate jurisdiction only, which in civil cases shall extend to the full extent of the State. Appeals from interlocutory judgments may be allowed with such exceptions and under such regulations as the Legislature may prescribe. The Supreme Court and the judges thereof, shall have power to issue the writ of habeas corpus, and under such regulations as may be prescribed by law, may issue the writ of mandamus and such other writs as may be necessary to enforce its jurisdiction.  
Sec. 4. The Supreme Court shall hold its session at the Capital, and two other places in the State.  
Sec. 5. That section twenty-eight, section forty and section forty-eight of article five of general provisions of the said Constitution be so amended as to hereafter read as follows: to-wit: Sec. 28. In each and every organized county in the State, there shall be an assessor and collector of taxes, elected by the people at the next ensuing general election, and every four years thereafter, who shall assess the property and collect the taxes so assessed in conformity to such laws as may now, or hereafter be enacted, hereafter by the Legislature, relative to the assessment and collection of taxes.  
Sec. 40. The Legislature shall not pass special laws in any of the following enumerated cases, that is to say: for locating or changing county seats; regulating the practice in Courts of Justice; regulating the duties and jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace and constables; providing for changes of venue in civil and criminal courts; incorporating cities or towns or changing or amending the charter of any city or village; providing for the management of common schools, regulating the rates of interest on money, regulating the positions of foremen, changing the law of descent in all other cases when a general law can be made applicable; or special laws shall be made applicable, no special law shall be enacted. The Legislature shall enact

general laws providing by the cases before enumerated in this section, and for all other cases which in its judgment may be provided by general laws, and, whereas section 50 of article 19 of the constitution provides that such proposed amendments shall be fully published in the public prints of this State at least three months before the next general election, of Representatives, for the consideration of the people, and it shall be the duty of the several returning officers at the next general election which shall be held to give a poll for and make a return to the Secretary of State of the names of all those entitled to vote on such proposed amendments. Now therefore, I, Edmund J. Davis Governor of Texas by virtue of the authority vested in me by the constitution and laws of this State, do hereby order and direct that at the next general election, viz: On the first Tuesday, being the 1st day of December, A. D. 1873, the polls be opened to receive the votes of those who desire to vote on said amendments, and the tickets shall have on them the words "For the Amendment" or "Against the Amendment." The amendments being voted for as a whole either for or against. It will be observed that the copies of the above recited Bill of Amendments shall seem to indicate a proposed amendment to section forty-eight of Article Twelve of the Constitution, but no such amendment is proposed in the body of the resolutions, therefore it will not be considered.

Returns will be made to the Secretary of State of the names of all persons voting for Representatives who have voted on such proposed amendments as provided in Section 50 of Article 12 of the Constitution. Said returns to be conducted in all other respects in accordance with the provisions of an act regulating elections, Approved March 31st 1873, and an act amending the same approved April 1st 1873.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto signed my name and caused the great seal of the State to be hereunto affixed at the city of Austin, this 15 day of August, A. D. 1873.

### Felicitous Frands.

In the northern states the Democracy has been flanked into shape. We mean by that expression to say that whenever it has thrown off the mask and attempted to seriously re-open any of those questions settled by the war, that it has then, and there, undergone such a discouraging mauling at the hands of the intelligent voters, that it has become eminently conservative. There, the Democracy has become, outwardly, an earnest advocate of non-sectarian public schools. It favors, in the newspapers, adequate protection to life and property, much to the disgust of the rowdy element that constitute the rank and file. In fact, the Democracy as a *bona fide* organization does not exist there. It no more resembles the red-mouthed, whiskey inspired demonism of the South, than does the wild yerra of the plains the painted male that is exhibited in traveling menageries, as the genuine animal.

In Texas, where illiteracy is almost as general as it is in Mexico or Louisiana, where, owing to geographical causes, murder and lawlessness are almost as rife as in Italy, or New York city under Tammany rule, it is not to be wondered at that the Democracy flourishes like a green bay tree. Peon laws are enacted, tree schools abolished, and all necessary barriers to murder and robbery are removed. Here is the paradise of the cross-roads Democracy.

If the Republican party proposes to resist this increasing tide of retrogression, that will sooner or later make the State a habitation for those only, who are opposed to a civilized state of society, then we must cease electing Republicans to office, who are more for their own pockets than they do for the party good.

They affect to represent. We mean to say that the county and municipal officers should be filled by aggressive, not passive, Republicans.

We are not calling the republicanism of anybody in question. We have no doubt that some of the gentlemen elected on the Republican ticket in this county are most excellent Republicans. They would be towers of strength in sections where there are no Democrats, or where the Democracy has found out which way the cat jumps, but for the present emergency in Texas, they are a little worse than superfluous. We might in this particular learn from our enemies. We never hear of Democratic officials ever emitting any such nonsense as that there are no politics in local affairs. That species of lunacy is confined almost entirely to those wretched namby pamby frauds that have been elected to office on the Republican ticket. They are neither hot nor cold, unless it is their personal interest to be so, and we trust that the time has come at last when the Republican party will spew them out of its mouth.

### The School Trustees.

Any person who will take the trouble to read the new school law with any degree of attention will see at once that the real object of the law was to prevent the establishment of public schools.

We call attention to merely one point, at present, which goes to show that we are correct. Sec. 20, is to the effect that on the first Tuesday in September an election for school trustees shall take place, but does not mention who shall order the election, nor to whom the election returns are to be made, and the general election law is silent on this point.

Sec. 21 requires the board of directors to give ten days notice of all elections to take place in the school districts. No time is specified when the trustees shall begin to discharge the duties of their office, but the natural presumption is, that immediately after their election they will proceed to take the scholastic census, procure school-houses, establish schools, and, of course, engage teachers.

But the public schools are to open on the first of September, while the school trustees, who are to open them are not elected until after the second of September.

According to the reading of the law no school is to be regarded as a free school, or have any claims on the school fund, which has not been opened as a free school by the trustees, and provided with teachers.

So, really, there can be no free schools.

### Telegraphic.

FOREIGN NEWS.

PARIS, Aug. 30.—A circular has been sent to the prefects of the departments forbidding demonstrations on the fourth of September, the anniversary of the proclamation of the republic.

It is reported that the government will pay to Germany the last installment of the war indemnity on the fourth of October.

Marshal Bazaine will be held for trial, it will commence on the 6th of October.

The Journal des Debats has a vigorous article from the pen of M. Lemoine, in which the writer expresses the opinion that a Republic is impossible, and that France must have a liberal monarchy. Count de Chambord, can follow the example of Louis XVIII and grant a constitutional charter, but if not, Monarchy under Chambord is as impossible as a Republic.

The government has issued decrees relieving grain and flour from tax.

MARSEILLE, Aug. 30.—A majority of the caucus are in session, and have resolved to suspend the session from the first of September to the third of November, and passed a vote of confidence on the different ministers before adjournment.

It is reported that Hidalgo will be appointed minister to the United States.

It is reported that Alfonso, Prince of Asturias, will shortly attempt to ascend the Spanish throne.

Telegrams from the north announce the defeat of the Carlists under Sabido, after four hours' fighting. Yesterday Gen. Cervera summoned the Carthagena insurgents to surrender. They answered by hoisting the black flag on their works.

As yet the operations before the town on the land side has amounted to but slight damage.

It is reported that the insurgents have agreed, if hard pushed, to deliver some forts to the Carlists on condition that all Carlists at Valencia (some 4000 in number) will join the insurgents in an attack on the Republican troops.

Two thousand Republican troops have arrived at Vetricin, in the province of Alva, on their way to Evora.

A project to raise a loan, the payment of which is to be guaranteed from the revenues of the tobacco monopoly of the Philippine Islands, has been presented in the Spanish Cortes. The bill also abolishes compulsory labor on the tobacco plantations by the natives. The motion was declared a good one.

MISCELLANEOUS.

LITTLE ROCK, Aug. 30.—Five thousand dollars reward is offered for the assassin of Judge Means.

It is reported that five persons were killed in the encounter between the constable's posse and Morris's gang, in Perry county.

WORCESTER, Aug. 30.—All the Butler delegates were elected.

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 29.—The relatives of Michael Angelo McFarland have taken charge of his body.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 29.—A heavy earthquake at San Jose, much excitement, but no damage. Heavy at the towns south, but slight here.

BOSTON, Aug. 30.—Associate Judge Horace Gray has been appointed to the vacant chief justice'ship of Massachusetts, caused by the death of Judge Chapman. The appointment had been previously tendered by Gov. Washburne to E. R. Hoar, who declined it.

CHOLERA.

LANCASTER, Ky., Aug. 30.—Twenty-seven cholera deaths. Sixty-three white families have left town.

NEW YORK.

NEW YORK, Aug. 30.—A Herald special dated at Carthage, says the British Admiral, Yalverton, informs the rebels of his intention to move the Victoria and Albion to Gibraltar.

At a meeting of the rebels a majority decided to open fire from the forts in case the removal of the Spanish ships is attempted.

The Admiral gives forty-eight hours warning, and threatens to bombard Carthage if the forts fire upon the ships.

A Washington dispatch says that five sailors made their appearance in Petersburg, Virginia, on Thursday, setting forth that they were part of fifteen survivors of the crew of the steamship Lucy burned at sea, forty-five miles off Cape Canaveral on the fifteenth instant. Their names are Charles Williams, George Johnson, J. E. Willis, George Fisher and Thomas Richardson. Two of them are suffering from terrible burns, which substantiate the truth of their story.

It is rumored that Samuel Booth, postmaster of Brooklyn, has resigned. It is said that C. C. Talbot, postmaster of Williamsburg, will probably succeed him in office.
