Whenes, The Legislature of the State of Texas by a joint resolution passed June 4th, 1873, has proposed certain amendments to the Constitution of mid State, which joint resolution reads as follows,

Texas.
SECTION 1. Be it resolved by the Legis-

Legislature.

SEC. 2. That section 2, section 3 and section 4 of article 5 of the said Constitution, be so amenned as to hereafter read as follows, to-wit: Section 2. The Supreme Court shall consist of one Onief Justice, and there and four Associate Justices, any stree of whom shall constitute a quorum. They shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate. for a term of nine years. All vacancies shall be filled for the udexpired term. If a vacancy shall occur, or a term shall expire when the Senate is not in session, the Governor shall fill the same by appointment, which shall be sent to the Senate within ten days after that body shall assemble, and if not confirmed the office shall immediately become vacant.

SEC. 3. The Supreme Court shall have appellate jurisdiction only, which in civil canses, shall be co-extensive with the limits of the State. Appeals from interlocutory judgments may be allowed with such exceptions and under such regulations as the Legislature may prescribe. The Supreme Court and the judges thereof, shall bave power to issue the writ of habeas corpus, and under such regulations as may be prescribed by law, may issue the writ of mandaums and such other writers way be necessary to enforce its own jurisdiction. The Supreme Court shall into have hower to assertain such matters of fact as may be necessary to the proper exercise of its jurisdiction.

SEC. 4. The Supreme Court shall hold its session at the Capital, and two other

The Legislature shall enact general laws providing by the cases before enumerated in this section, and for all
