A German Democratic Candidate. At last we have a genuine miracle. The Democratic Convention has put a German on the State ticket, and what a magnificent specimen of German manhood he is, to be sure. But, to speak candidly, we feel rather puffed up with pride that the Democracy has been compelled, solely, to recognize the political influence of the Germans. It affords us unbounded satisfaction to recognize in the nomination of Mr. Gross, one of the first fruits of the German convention, for nobody ever dreamed of giving a German a chance at the public crib.

The Democrats have been compelled to do what the Republicans have repeatedly done in 1869 and 1873. At last the despised Dutchman is regarded as an equal, and from now on people will touch their hats to him and call him "our German fellow-citizen."

Mr. J. J. Gross is the man upon whom this unexpected honor has fallen. Unlike McLane, the veritable man, he is a man of sense. May we be permitted to enquire, "who is Gross?" or rather, "why is Gross?"

We regret the necessity of expending the public gaze on a man of no retiring a disposition, but since uncle Groos has consented to be the tool of a coterie of pot-house politicians, we intend to disturb his slumbers with a calcium light of considerable brilliancy.

On the heels of the Comal there vegetates lo! these many years, a meek man; a very meek man, a slow coach, a perfect Jno. Ireland of a slow coach, one of those men who are so lazy that they are supposed to have been born tired, whose capacities are startlingly commonplace. In the town of New Braunfels his name is known, but outside of the corporate limits the enquiry is universal, "who is Gross?" If his most intimate friend were to be taken out at midnight and whipped, he could not tell under what these trying circumstances, what Gross had ever done for his countrymen to deserve this distinction. It would be, however, much more difficult to ascertain what his qualifications for the office really are. As proprietor of the Schmitz House, he developed qualifications which would not cause any ordinary business man to entrust with the management of the most ordinary transactions. He is, we believe, agent for a fire insurance company.

That the Democracy stoops to pick up such material, is proof of how utterly worthless the party is. Among the Germans of Texas there are many men of education and capacity, whose election would reflect credit on the German name. Do none of them belong to the Democratic party? Was the selection of Gross a matter of dire necessity? Was the intention to glorify the former banner county of the Democracy? Even in that event a better man could have been selected.

We will explain how this miraculous nomination was got up. The truth is, the Democracy is afraid that it will lose the entire German vote, particularly, as Jacob Kuechler is a very strong candidate. The Democracy does not take into consideration for a moment, that the re-election of Kuechler would be beneficial for the whole State. He is a Republican and that guarantees the ill-will of the Democracy, no matter how great his services may have been. It is believed, that, besides the entire German vote, he will receive the support of many Democrats, who have an opportunity of observing his capacity and honesty. Hence, it was determined to put up a German against a German, and the New Braunfels clique was a party to the infamous transaction. They even tried to persuade the Democrats that Gross would bring the Democracy 5000 German votes.

Jacob Kuechler deserved some recognition for his excellent management of the Land Office at a time when the State had no means, for his courtesy, and the facilities afforded the public, and the capable and conscientious manner in which he has performed his duties, and he has received this recognition from the Republican party.

The election will teach the Democracy that the mere hoisting of the name of some insignificant German will not have the desired effect with the German voters.—Pres. Press.

(Special to the Telegraph.) FROM HEMPHREAD. HEMPHREAD, Sept. 7, 1873. Yellow fever scares on the German. The favorable reports from Houston and Galveston prompted the city authorities here to abolish the quarantine to-day, until satisfactory evidence of the absence of the disease. X.

Castellar received 133 votes in the Cortes against 67 for Margal. Marshal Serrano has arrived in Madrid. The leaders of the insurrection in Cartagena have sent a communication to Admiral Telvort, protesting against sending Spanish frigates to Gibraltar.

London, Sept. 7.—A special from Berlin to London says the Prussian Government has decided to reorganize Bischoff, Keisler, Baken and Barovis, and will follow the example of Prussia.

A demonstration in favor of the rights of laboring men was made in South London. There was a large procession and meeting, with six thousand present.

The Spanish correspondent of the Standard states that five men, who were sent from Madrid to assassinate Don Carlos, have been executed at Estella.

The Republicans are casting guns for the defense of San Sebastian.

The Cortes on Saturday discussed the appointment of Chief Executive Powers. Senator Flo Y. Margal made a speech defending his administration. Late in the evening the sitting was suspended to be resumed at 11 p. m., and lasted all night.

The house is still in session. The election of Castellar is considered certain. He is looked upon as the savior of the country. On succeeding to power he will probably appoint Repartero, Generalissimo, Marshal Serrano Commander-in-Chief of forces in the North, and Gen. Cuneba Captain General of Catalonia.

The garrison at Berge was besieged by Carlists, but threatened to evacuate the town unless supplies arrive soon.

Paris, Sept. 7.—The French Government has received notice from Berlin that France, having fulfilled all her engagements, the occupation of her territory by German forces is legally ended. The evacuation of Verdun by Germans has begun.

Dresden, Sept. 7.—An annual general meeting was held at Chemnitz to-day in favor of the release of the Fenian prisoners.

It is now considered as settled that ex-President Johnson will stump Tennessee in his own behalf this fall as a candidate for Governor.
