WHEREAS, The Legislature of the State of Texas by a joint resolution passed June 4th, 1873, has proposed certain amendments to the Constitution of said State, which joint resolution reads as follows,

Joint resolution proposing amendments to section twenty of article one, Bill of Rights, to section two, section three and section four of article five, section twenty-eight, section forty and to section forty-eight of article twelve of general provisions of the Constitution of the State of Texas,

SECTION 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas, That section twenty of article one, Bill of Rights of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be so aniended as to hereafter read as follows to-wit.

8sc. 20. No power of anspending laws in the State shall be exercised except by the

SEC. 2. That section 2, section 3 and section 4 of article 5 of the said Constitution, he so amenned as to hereafter read as follows, fo-wit: Section 2. The Supreme Court shall consist at one Chief Justice and four Associate Justices, any three of whom shall constitute a quorum. They shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of nine years. All vacancies shall be filled for the udexpired term. If a vacancy shall occur, or a term shall expire when the Senate is not in session, the Governor shall fill the same by appointment, which shall be sent to the Senate within ten days after that body shall assemble, and if not confirmed the office shall immediately become vacant.

SEC. 3. The Supreme Court shall have appellate jurisdiction only, which in civil causes, shall be do-extensive with the limits of the State. Appeals from interlocutory judgments may be allowed with such exceptions and under such regulations as the Legislature may prescribe. The Supreme Court and the judges thereof, shall be very or the second by law, may issue the writ of manufamus and such other writs as may be necessary to enforce its own jurisdiction. The Supreme Court shall since have hower to assertain such mattery of inet as may be necessary to enforce its own jurisdiction. The Supreme Court shall hold its aession at the Capital, and two other

NEC. 40. The Legislature shall nest passocial or special laws in any of the fullowing enumerated cases, that is to say for ceating or changing county seats; vegulocating or changing county scatt? regulating the practice in Courts of Justice; regulating the duties and jurisdiction of Justice of the Peace and constabled; providing for changes of venns in civil and criminal course; incorporating civies or Lowns or changing or amending the charter of any city or village; providing for the management of common schools, regulating the racts of interest on money, remitting, fines, penalties or foristines, changing the law of descent in all other cases when a general law can be made applicable no special law shall be enacted; or in any case when a general law shall be enacted. The Legislature shall enact general laws providing by the cases before summerated in this section, and for all other cases which in its judgement may be provided by general laws, and, whereas section 50 of article 12 of the constitution provides that anch proposed amendments chall be date and in the continuous other cases which in its judgement may be provided by general laws, and, whereas section 50 to article 12 of the constitution provides that such proposed amendments shall be day published in the public prints of this State at least three months befor the next general election of Representatives, for the consideration of the people, and it shall be the daty of the several returning officers at the pext general election which shall be thus holden to open a-poil for and make a return to the Secretary of State of the names of all those voting for Representatives who have yound on such proposed amendments. Now therefore, I, Edmund J. Davis Governor of Texas by virtue of the authority vested in by me the constitution and laws of this State, do hereby order and direct that at the next general election, vis. On the first Tuesday, being the 2nd day of December A. D. 1873, the polis be opened to receive the votes of those who desire to you on said amendments, and the ticket used shall have on them the words "For the Amendments" or "Against the Amendments" in as a whole either for or against.
