The following article has been copied from "Harper Weekly". It is not offered to elicit the applause of Democrats, but to cordially recommend it to the thoughtful perusal of every unprejudiced man.

**THE REPUBLICANS IN TEXAS.** - Not any one of the Southern States has suffered more deeply in all its history from the influence of the Republican party than Texas. Its present Legislature was composed of the worst elements of a dying faction. It solicited a visit from Jefferson Davis, and welcomed him to the Executive mansion. It refused to offer a similar token of respect to the President. It has labored to break up the wisest part of the population, and would create ignorance and barbarism. The Ku-Klux rule in many parts of Texas, and even moderate Republicans are often threatened with knives and pistols, or are ordered to leave the State by secret assassins.

It is probable that nothing but their system of terrorism has kept the rebel element in power, and the fatal injuries they have inflicted upon the State have already arrested the progress of the better portion of its people. A considerable German population which exists in Texas may be relied upon to aid the party of order. The colored voters are one-third of the whole. The Republicans have nominated respectable candidates, and hope to break down that rule of terror which has frightened away immigration, and made Texas so unprofitable a country to settle in.

Under a rational and orderly government it is plain that Texas might become one of the wealthiest and most populous States of the Union. At present its population is only 2,000,000, whereas California has nearly 1,000,000 more. It already produces 350,000 bales of cotton annually, and an immense crop of Indian corn. But the immense wealth of Texas is being wasted in the great herds of cattle. It is not adapted for grazing. It already supplies the Western States with a large part of their food. Nearly four millions of neat cattle range over its wide pastures. No other State can approach it in this particular, and did it possess a sufficient system of internal communication, the cattle of Texas might be made to feed the cities of the North. A large part of them are now slaughtered for their hides, and many perish on their way to a market. But with proper railway facilities, and the improvement of the rivers and harbors, its herds would be a source of wealth and civilization.

This is the policy which the Republican leaders have pursued. They have sought to build railways, and enforce education. The success of the Republican party in the approaching election will make the Texas situation still more desperate. It will drive the assassin and the midnight robber into obscurity, and expunge them from the legislative; it will secure the free and property of the whole population, and will sweep away the last traces of the rebel faction; it will make Galveston and Austin the centers of unimpeded commerce, and will give to Texas a new and a better future.

**CONVENTION**  
**THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND THE ORANGE FREE STATE.**  
PREAMBLE, COMMUNIST AND EXTENSION.  
Concluded December 22, 1871.  
Revised by President George Fred Stone May 10, 1872.  
Ratifications exchanged at Washington August 15, 1873.  
Proclamation August 23, 1873.  
By the President of the United States of America.

**A PROCLAMATION.**  
Whereas a general convention of friends of the United States of America and the Orange Free State was concluded and signed by their respective plenipotentiaries, at Amsterdam, on the twenty-second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, which general convention it was the duty of the President of the United States to give effect to, and whereas the said convention is now in force, and the President of the United States has the honor to announce that the same is now in force, and the President of the United States has the honor to announce that the same is now in force, and the President of the United States has the honor to announce that the same is now in force.

The United States of America and the Orange Free State, equally animated by the desire to draw more closely the bonds of friendship which so happily exist between the two nations, and to give to their respective citizens, the benefits of peace, friendship, commerce and civilization, have agreed to the following articles:

**ARTICLE 1.**  
The citizens of one of the two countries residing or established in the other shall be free from personal military service; but they shall be liable to the pecuniary or other contributions which may be levied by way of appropriation, from citizens of the country where they reside, who are exempt from the said service.

**ARTICLE 2.**  
No citizen of either of the two countries shall be liable to pay for the purchase of real estate or other property, or for the purchase of property for public purposes, of the citizens of the country in which they reside, nor any contribution whatsoever which the latter shall not be liable to pay.

**ARTICLE 3.**  
The citizens of each one of the contracting parties shall have power to dispose of their personal property within the jurisdiction of the other, by sale, donation, or in any other manner, and their heirs, whether by testament or otherwise, or their successors, being citizens of the same party, shall succeed to the said property or interest, and they shall make the possession thereof, either by themselves or by others acting for them; they may dispose of the same as they may think proper, paying no other charges than those to which the inhabitants of the country wherein the said property is situated shall be liable to pay in a similar case. In the absence of such heir, wife, or other successors, the same shall be taken by the authorities for the preservation of the property of a native of the country of the same country, until the lawfully proper heir shall have had time to take possession for himself.

**ARTICLE 4.**  
Any controversy which may arise among the citizens of the two countries shall be decided according to the laws and the judges of the country in which the property may be situated.

**ARTICLE 5.**  
The contracting parties give to each other the right of having their citizens, in their respective States, consuls and vice-consuls of their own appointment, who shall enjoy the same privileges as those of the most favored nation.

**ARTICLE 6.**  
Neither of the contracting parties shall levy duties on the goods or effects of the citizens of the other, or on the products of the soil or industry of the place in which they reside.

**ARTICLE 7.**  
Each of the contracting parties hereby consents to grant to the citizens of the other to any nation which shall not immediately be enjoyed by the other party.

**ARTICLE 8.**  
The United States of America and the Orange Free State, on regulations made in their name through the medium of their respective diplomatic or consular agents, shall give to the citizens of the other, the same rights and privileges as those which they grant to the citizens of the most favored nation.
