MEETING AT THE COTTON EXCHANGE.

Speech of Gov. Davis.

In response to a call for business men to meet the governor at the rooms of the Cotton Exchange yesterday afternoon, some fifty or sixty leading merchants and citizens assembled there at the hour designated.

The vice president of the Exchange, Mr. McAlpin, opened proceedings by saying that as the meeting was not one of the members of the Exchange, but was to be participated in by citizens generally, it would propose that the mayor be called on to preside, which was seconded and approved by those present.

Mayor Harris asked Mr. Cyrus Thompson to act as secretary. His Honor then remarked that Gov. Davis wished to address himself to the business men of the city on the issues of the day. He then introduced the governor to the meeting.

The governor proceeded to say: That he was here for the purpose of addressing the people of the city on the political prospects and issues. He was aware of the fact that at least four-fifths of those present had been in opposition to him and his administration, but he hoped they would be converted to his way of thinking by the plain, practical suggestions he intended to present to them.

He was himself an old Galvestonian, and felt an abiding faith and interest in the prosperity of the city. He had once known every man and almost every woman in Galveston, but the progress of the city had been so great within the twenty six years which had passed since he first came here, that he now recognized very few of the faces before him.

It was not his intention to speak particularly to Democrats or Republicans—he wished to address himself to the business men of the state, and he hoped they would accord to him honestly of purpose, if they did not endorse him and his official acts. He was willing to acknowledge that he was an interested party in all that he proposed to say, and that on that account there were plausible grounds for objecting to his deductions.

The questions open for discussion in the current which he was now considering were four:—but they were clearly defined, and what he wished particularly to ask business men to consider was the proposed revision of the Constitution of the State, which he would call a constitutional convention immediately after getting possession of the state government, and another that had been done since the re-issuance of the state into the Union. This was the only distinctive plank in the Democratic platform.

He would ask the merchants and business men of the city if they believed for a moment that the proposed Constitutional Convention should be held that article first of the Bill of Rights, which he would read to them, would be retained. As sensible men, knowing the motives for which the Convention would be called, they could not believe that the following paragraph would be expunged from the Bill of Rights:

ARTICLE I—BILL OF RIGHTS.

That the privilege of the citizenry to assemble, which brought the country to this, may be maintained from future political domination; that public order may be preserved; that private property and business interests may be protected; that the rights of liberty and equality secured in an earlier generation, shall be maintained.

He would not stop to discuss the question as to whether the occasion was a happy or not. This had been settled by force of arms. He would only ask whether the clause he had read would be retained in the constitution, should the Democrats become the possessors of the state government, and the proposed constitutional convention be called. If the gentleman present believed that this provision would remain undisturbed, then his argument would fall to the ground and there would be nothing left to consider.

The people of Galveston were asked to get federal assistance towards despoiling the Approver to their wharves, they were talking about sending a committee to Washington to urge upon the general government their claim to an appropriation for the wharves, he had mentioned. They would ask business men if they were likely to suppose that the members of the government would be responsible to the committee was appointed; they would not say any business unless they knew the committee was controlled by the federal government and the Republican party, which now controlled and would continue to control the government for the next quarter of a century. If they did keep in harmony, he believed that

THE CONVENTION OF AUGUST 1, 1873, BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND BELGIUM.

The General Post-Office of the United States and the Postal Administration of Belgium having recognized the propriety of reducing the rates of postage fixed by the Convention of August 1, 1873, and by the additional Convention of 1st March, 1870, the respective governments have agreed upon the following articles:

ARTICLE I.

The international single rate for printed letters, by the direct steamship line, to be established between the two countries, in conformity with article six of the Convention of August 1, 1873, shall be 4 cents for weight, to be paid by the addressee of the letter, and shall be in force from the 1st of January, 1874.
