under some form in France bang suspended in the scales of fate. It is still uncertain on which side the balance will incline. While wavering in this uncertainty some comparition of the government or of one of the political parties, in which the French have much experience, may precipitate a crisis and cause the scales to kick the beam. Let us glance at the state of affairs and see what are the probabilities. It seems impossible that the present abnormal and provisional govern-BUILDERS AND BUILDING parties admit that. Monarchists of parties admit that. Menarchists of all shades, imperialists and republicans, regard the actual government only as provisional and short of duration. Hence the efforts of these conflicting parties to try their strength. The republicans in the Assembly, however, being the parties of the sample of the parties of the sample of Assembly, however, being in a minority, wish to appeal to the country through a general election. The majority, which comes under the general term of the Right, and which is made up of the legisimists, the Orleanists and the imperialists, appears to be intent on giving a definite form of government to France through the action of the Assembly and the Executive, with

out appealing to the people. As the time for the reasembling of the National Assembly approaches the different factions manifest activity, as if the solution of this ducstion were to be forced at that ime. A meeting of the so-called conservatives-that is, the monarchists-was field at Paris on Thursday to discuss the matter About sixty persons, our telegram says, attended, and among them were Baron Decazes, M. de la Roch-efoucauld, M. de Kerdrei and Count Dara. A confident feeling prevailed. Some of the speakers claimed there would be a majority of twenty at the next session of the Assembly in favor of the restoration of mon archy. The republicum members, taking alarm from the movements and possible action of the monarchists, propose, it is said, when the Assembly meets, to introduce a declaration against any infringement of the popular sovereignty, and, if not adopted, to resign their seats. Should this be the purpose of the republican members the monarchists may be more disposed to make the issue, having a majority; for such an act of abnegation on the part of the republicaus would leave the course clear to the mon-

Although three years have not passed since these nuparalleled disastors, yet the counterpart of the condition. in that short time, has preserved peace at home and abroad, has restored the finances to a flourishing condition, and has promoted manu-tactures, industry, trade at home and commerce abroad. Never, perhaps, was France in a more promising way as to material prosperity.
Why, then, it may be asked, should the Republic be destroyed? But these surprising results of a repub lican form of government have no weight with the monarchists, who orefer the glitter of a crown and the avors they expect from it. The welfare of France is made subservient to their prejudices and inter ests - New York Herald.







PROCLAMATION By the Governor of the State of Toxas.

To all to whom these presents shall come:

Winnesse, The Legislature of the State
of Texas by a joint resolution paned June
4th, 1872, has preposed certain amendments to the Constitution of said State,
which joint resolution reads as follows,
vis i.

Joint resolution proposing amendments to section twenty of article one, Bill of Biglish, to section two, section three and section four of article five, section twenty-night, section forty and to section forty eight of article twelve of general profisions of the Constitution of the State of

SECTION 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas. That section twenty of article one. Bill of Rights of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be so smended as to horeafter read as follows: Sec. 20. No power of suspending laws in the State shall be exercised except by the

SEC. 20. No power or suspending laws in the State shall be exercised except by the Legislature.

SEC. 2. That section 2, section 3 and section 4 of article 5 of the said Constitution, we so americal as to bereafter read as follows, to-wit: Section 2. The Supreme Court shall constitute as to bereafter read as follows, to-wit: Section 2. The Supreme Court shall constitute a quorum. They shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of nine years. All vacancies shall be filled for the udexpired term. If a vacancy shall occur, or a term shall expire when the Senate is not in session, the Governor shall fill the same by appointment, which shall be sout to the Senate within ten days after that body shall assemble, and if not confirmed the office shall immediately become vacant.

SEC. 3. The Supreme Court shall have appellate jurisdiction only, which in civil causes, shall be co-extensive with the limits of the State. Appeals from interlocatory judgments may be allowed with such exceptions and under such regulations as the Legislature may prescribe. The Supreme Court and the judges thereof, shall have

ceptions and under such regulations as the Legislature may prescribe. The Supreme Court and the judges thereof, shall have power to issue the writ of babeas corpus, and under such regulations as may be prescribed by law, may issue the writ of mandamns and such other writs as may be necessary to enforce its own jurisdiction. The Supreme Court shall also have howest to assertain such matters of fact as may be necessary to the proper exercise of its jurisdiction.

SEC. 4. The Supreme Court shall hold its session at the Capital, and two other places in the State.
