Importing President Lincoln
A writer in the *Christian Union* describes graphically the daily life which our martyr President led in the month of September, 1864:
The first to lay her petition before the President was a tall, thin, severe maiden lady of 45, with cork-screw curls and squeaky shoes, and something so dally, Brassias, about her that I looked up involuntarily to see if the brown turban was not reposing upon her brow. She poured forth her wrongs in a shrill tone, and with a volubility startling to hear.
The President heard her through with exemplary patience, and then, looking up, said, "What, you hope again? Aren't you married yet?"
I could imagine what he must have suffered day after day from her shrill volubility. However, he told her once more what she had better do about her horse, which she said our soldiers had seized, and sent her on her way, apparently satisfied.
Next an old lady hobbled up. Her son was accused of being a deserter, she said, and he wasn't at all; he just came home to see his old mother.
President—"Did he have a leave of absence?"
Old Lady—"Well, no; I can't say he did. He thought he would slip off and see his old mother a bit and not make any fuss about it, disturbing the gentleman as in his better."
President—"How long did he stay?"
Old Lady—"O, only a little matter of two or three weeks."
President—"Did he go back before the soldiers came for him?"
Old Lady—"Well, no; I can't rightly say he did, sir, but he would have gone if he had known how much they needed him, I know."
The President then explained, as kindly and clearly as he could, that as Commander-in-Chief of the army he could not allow proceedings of that sort, for that just before a battle all his soldiers would be wanting to see their mothers, and that matters would have to take their usual course.
The next persons to engage the attention of the President were the happy parents of a young gentleman of tender years, probably about 2. They were a very delightful looking trio, and the old of gladness seemed fairly to exude from the mother's glowing brow, as she bore her son and held him up to the President's desk.

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The Pope's Brief with Reference to Pilgrimages.
[Eco d'Italia, New York, Sept. 24.]
To all the faithful who read these words health and apostolic benediction. While the wickedness of the impious has filled our heart with care and bitterness, God in these most baneful times has caused many faithful ones to rise in all parts of the Catholic world, who, on the contrary strive to turn our grief and affliction into comfort by so many testimonials of their affection, by their numerous works of Christian piety. Among these works are frequent and largely attended pilgrimages, which take place in the more illustrious churches and sanctuaries for the purpose of imploring of God, the fount of every consolation, and through the merits and intercession of the blessed Virgin, Mary Immaculate, and of the saints, the long desired peace of the Church, its triumph, and the liberty of the holy apostolic seat. But since some holy pilgrimages which were to be made to the most celebrated sanctuaries in Italy at the same time have been, to the sorrow of all good men, interdicted, some of the faithful of our City of Bologna proposed to invite all Catholics to a spiritual pilgrimage to take place during this present month of September—a pilgrimage which they proposed to divide into three decades of ten days each. In the first decade, the faithful, meeting for that end suitable and devout prayers, should imagine themselves taken in spirit to those parts of the Holy Land sanctified by Jesus, our divine Redeemer, in the second decade to the principal sanctuaries of Italy, and in the third decade to the principal foreign sanctuaries. The faithful having thus made humble supplication to heaven, we will grant, by virtue of apostolic commission, certain indulgences in favor of this pious exercise. We, praying in the highest manner their sacred and generous project, willingly undertake to respond to the prayers which they offer for us in the following manner: Considering in the mercy of God Almighty and in the authority of his blessed apostles, Peter and Paul, and all the faithful of both sexes, those at least who with contrite heart on any day of the next month of September will perform the aforesaid pious exercise and go through the spiritual pilgrimage—we remit to the accustomed form of the Church 300 days of the punishment due to their sins or in whatever manner incurred. Moreover, to all the faithful of both sexes who for a whole decade (of days) will comply with the same holy formula of devotion, make the spiritual pilgrimage, and on a day selected truly penitent confess and go to communion, devoutly visit any church or public oratory, and there offer prayers for God for unity among Christian princes, the extirpation of heresy, the conversion of sinners, and the exaltation of our another above, we mercifully grant through the Lord, plenary indulgence and the remission of all their sins. All and each of these indulgences, remissions of sins, and commendation of punishment may be applied, in a manner of suffrage, to the souls of those who have passed off of this life and whose peace with God has been fully established. Notwithstanding our sole and that of the apostolic chancery (consequence) not to grant indulgence of any kind, and the other satisfactions and apostolic decrees, and whatever else to the contrary, we grant the indulgence stated in this intimation.
