

to acction twenty of article one, Bill of

section four of article five, section twentyeight, acction forty and to section fortysignt of article twelve of general provisions of the Constitution of the State of
Texas.

Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas, That section
twenty of article one, Bill of Rights of the
Constitution of the State of Texas, be so
amended as to hareafter read as follows
to-with.

Sec. 20: No power of suspending laws in the State shall be exercised except by the

Legislature.

SEC. 2. That section 2, section 3 and section 4 of article 5 of the said Constitution, be so amenaged as to hereafter read as follows, to wit: Section 2. The Supreme Court shall consist of one Chief Justice and four Associate Justices, any three of whom shall constitute a quorum. They shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senats, for a term of nine years. All vacancies shall be filled for the udexpired term. If a yacancy shall occur, or a term shall exa yacancy shall occur, or a term shall ex-pire when the Senate is not in consion, the Governor shall fill the same by appoint-ment, which shall be sent to the Senate within ten days after that budy shall as-semble, and if not confirmed the office shall immediately become vacants. shall immediately become vacant.

SEC. 3. The Supreme Court shall have appoliate jurisdiction only, which in civil jurisdiction only, which is civil reases, shall be co-extensive with the limits of the State. Appeals from interlocutory judgments may be allowed with such exceptions and under such regulations at the Legislature may prescribe. The Supreme Court and the judges thereof, shall have power to issue the writ of habeas corpus, and under such regulations as may be preserted by law, may issue the writ of manismus and such other writs as may be necessary to enforce its own jurisdiction.
