Phases of American Infidency.

The Rev. William F. Warren, D. D., of the M. E. University of Bostou, read a paper on the forces and forms which unbelief has assumed in America. The great revival of 1740 had permented the population of the American colonies with an earnest religious belief. About half a century later French infidelity began its inroads. We were grateful to the French for their help in the revolution, and French infidelity was then an epidemic from which America did not escape. Three doubting Thomases, Jefferson, Coo per, and Paine, were the hiero phants of the new gospel. The first was influential by virtue of his polities station; the second by reason of his office as educator, and the third in consequence of his early and ardent advocacy of the cause of Paints, Oils, Window-glass and American independence. Jefferson made Paine the nation's guest, and the latter's Age of Reason exercised an influence which was first and thing possible to prevent the closeffectually broken by the great re ingotmanulacturing estably ivals of 1801-03. Owen and Panny Wright and sev eral of their associates were fore eigners. So was Ann Lee, the ear ly forerunner of American spiritual ism. We have no native Strauss, Regan, or even Carl Vogt. The nearest approach to a native gabe liceer of national reputation was Theodore Parker. Haif the de-structive power of European infi delity has been due to the presence of the party within instead of with out the Church. The extra ecclesi astical position of infidelity in America has greatly assisted American Christians. American Christinns are not specially disturbed by the presence of the various forms of unbelief in our land.



WHEREAS, The Lagislature of the State
of Texas by a joint resolution passed June
4th, 1873, has proposed certain amendments to the Constitution of said State,

The Supreme Court shall consists of one Chief Justice and four Associate Justices, any three of whom shall constitute a quorum. They shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of nine years, All vacancies shall be filled for the udexpired term. If a vacancy shall occur, or a term shall expire when the Senate is not in mession, the Governor shall fill the same by appointment, which shall be sout to the Senate within ten days after that body shall as-

Governor shall fill the same by appointment, which shall be sent to the Senate within ten days after that body shall assemble, and if not confirmed the office shall immediately become vacant.

SEC. 3. The Supreme Court shall have appellate jurisdiction only, which in civil causes, shall be co-extensive with the limits of the State. Appeals from interlocutory judgments may be allowed with such exceptions and under such regulations as the Legislature may prescribe. The Supreme Court shall have power to issue the writ of mandamas and such other writs as may be necessary to enforce its own jurisdiction. 
