The Trial of Marshal Bazaine.

It is now three years since the French Empire collapsed, and since Marshal Bazaine, surrendering to the German foe committed the offense for which he now stands upon the scaffold. The trial has for some reason, wise or unwise, just or unjust, been deferred until the present, and it promises to be quite as protracted as it is likely to be interesting.

In the Herald of this morning, we print an instructive letter from the pen of one of our correspondents in Paris on the subject. The letter gives some points of detail which have not yet been made public through the press, and which, it is reasonable to presume, are not generally known on this side of the Atlantic. For this reason it well deserves to be read. From the nature of the charge it appears that Bazaine may, if found guilty, be sentenced to degradation and death or banishment from the service with or without degradation. The Marshal, therefore, does not stand between the sole ultimate of death or acquittal, as has commonly been supposed. He may be simply dismissed from the service. What the actual result of the trial may be it is, of course, at present simply impossible to say. Many rumors point to the possibility of the extreme sentence. It found guilty of the charge as the French army and people would no doubt be satisfied to see Bazaine punished as a traitor to his country. It is reasonable, however, to conclude that the milder sentence will be at once more generally well pleasing to the French people and more in harmony with the personal feelings of the judges. For a sketch of the trial we refer our readers to our correspondent's letter. Of the seven judges, of whom the Duc d'Aumale is President, only two, according to our correspondent, are likely to declare emphatically against Bazaine. The other five, it is confidently expected, will put the most favorable construction on the acts of the Marshal. It is not at all impossible that the progress of the trial may put a new aspect on the whole case. Still these opinions, from a well informed witness on the spot, are not without considerable weight.

In our judgment Bazaine has one justifiable cause of complaint. His trial has been too long deferred. There has been no necessary reason for the delay, so far as the ends of justice were concerned. It does seem as if it had been delayed for political reasons, and in order to serve a political purpose. It will not be difficult, in the course of the trial, to expose certain weak points in the Imperial edifice, and to explain the suddenness of its fall and the consequent misfortunes of France. It would not be wonderful if this is the reason why the trial, so long delayed, has been brought on at this particular juncture. Well laid schemes have often times failed, and it would not be wonderful if failure resulted from this one. Bazaine may perish through the tyranny of the dominant party. But Bazaine may live to have his acts approved by a more generous generation. Let us hope that justice will prevail but let us hope, also, that justice will be tempered with mercy.

This Day's State Elections.

The State elections of Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana and Iowa come off to-day. Their results will doubtless show in every case an immense falling off from the popular vote of last year, for we have never known such "general apathy" among the people in reference to party politics as that which now prevails throughout the country. It is probable that, by greatly reduced majorities on a short vote, the republicans, as usual, will carry all the four States named. Should they lose any one of them they will have to look out for their laurels in New York and other States in November. Outside of the States which vote to-day very little interest is felt for the results therein, excepting the results in Ohio and Iowa. In regard to which certain new elements in the field may, it is widely supposed, materially disturb the calculations of the republican politicians.

In Ohio, under the style and title of the people's party, the liberal republicans are running their own candidate for Governor, and as the strength of this new party in the State neither ten, twenty or thirty thousand, has never been discovered by the regular republicans have been working for a margin to cover losses, which may foot up to ten, twenty or thirty thousand. The elections of last year, when the liberal republicans were fused with the democratic party, afforded no test of the liberal strength, because the old democratic Republicans, who had not against Greeley, anticipated in every State the republicans

he carried over to the democratic side. Now, however, with the whole democratic vote in Ohio united upon Allen for Governor, and with the liberals doing their best for their own candidates, it is thought probable or possible that they may carry off the republican balance of power, and so secure the election of Allen. Hence the public curiosity outside of Ohio in reference to the results of this Ohio election.

In Iowa the democratic party has disappeared in its fusion with farmers' granges upon their anti-monopoly State ticket, and as many republicans are identified with this anti-monopoly party, the results of this election in Iowa may be somewhat surprising to the republican managers. But, whether the grangers' success or fail in this trial, it may doubtless be regarded as the beginning of an independent anti-monopoly movement which will enter very largely into next year's elections for a new Congress.

A Recent Look at Paris.

[Paris Correspondent New York Graphic.]

After one has "gone the rounds" and had moonlight views and sunlight views in the leading European cities, he invariably returns to Paris with a home-again feeling, and exclaims, "How magnificent is Paris!" Six months has changed nothing materially. There is a scaffolding in the Place Vendôme, for the fallen column is going up again. But that will be slow work, for it was terribly shattered and fractured. Workmen are perched around on the walls of the Tuilleries, filling the air with dust and confusion with their hammers, and just what is to bring forth, nobody seems to quite understand. Marshal McMahon has come into power and into the photograph window. He is decorated and he ribboned, of course he pleases the French love of display better than did the simple black coat of M. Thiers. Then there are photographs huddled together of the legion of aspirants to the French throne. If they would form a little army of themselves and adjust their claims with swords and pistols, it would be a great relief all around. One enterprising photographer has published a most remarkable card of Bonapartists, including the four Napoleons and their wives—Josephine, Marie, Louis and Eugenie. It is a sort of "happy family" group. Eugenie and Napoleon the Fourth are out in new photographs—the Prince is really growing very young in air and attitude and Eugenie looking more insouciant than ever. Pencilled eyebrows and blackened eyelashes always speak out in sun-pictures, and her smiling face and widow's cap don't harmonize. Madame McMahon looks stolid and substantial, and as if she might be a sister of Victoria, of England.

The War in Central Asia.

It is probable that the civilization of the Khanates of Central Asia will be refuted for generations to come, unless a practicable effort be made by Russia to consolidate their feebly and quarrelsome governments by the strong military arm. The letter which we publish this morning, dated Tashkent, from the pen of an intrepid Herald correspondent, after recounting the bloody history of Khokh's during the present generation, gives a state of the rebellion now in progress. The wars have been purely dynastic, and like all dynastic wars in Asia, they have been unexampled for their cruelty. Father against son and brother against brother—this has been the fashion of the fighting. We can see no possible reason why a Power bent on assuring her own supremacy in Asia should not, by active measures, prevent a repetition of the barbarities so cruelly stated by our correspondent. As long as Khokh, like Chiva, lives within her self, it may be assumed that she will learn little of the turbulence and atrocities of peoples dwelling beyond the darkness of that dark Continent. Now, then, can these war-mongering Khanates, of which Khokh is but an example, be brought within the pale of civilization? By the construction of the railway to India, as proposed by that daring engineer, M. de Lesseps. This is the only possible mode of relief in any country, where there is perpetual anarchy. The day of camel civilization has gone by, and it is folly to talk of the development of any country where the burden is not borne by the "iron horse." Egypt, if she had been left to live within herself, India, if she had not been divided by the rail, and Eastern and Southern Europe, too, if they had turned their backs on the locomotive, would have all remained in a state of stagnation. We see, then, in this war, legislation as it may appear, a strong reason why the Imperial Government, co-operating with Great Britain, should at once begin the survey

and construction of the railway destined to break through the Hindoo Kooah.

The murder of a printer in this office by one of the editors, says the Atlanta Herald, may be explained and justified in a very few words. The editor wrote the following sentence: "No undigested sin was lying on his conscience," and the late type made it read: "An old white man was laying on his conscience." The editor was discharged yesterday on the ground of "commendable homicide," and complimented highly by the court on his promptness.

The respectable Italians of New York have discovered a new method of overreaching the padrones. One of the latter was taken in charge Tuesday, on his arrival from Memphis with fourteen boys; his money was taken from him and he was ordered to leave the city. This method of securing justice is not strictly legal, but it is at least right and it ought to be encouraged.
