



PROCLAMATION By the Governor of the State of Texas.

WHEREAS, The Legislature of the State of Texas by a joint resolution passed June 4th, 1873, has proposed certain amendments to the Coustistion of said State, which joint resolution reads as follows,

Joint resolution proposing amondments to section twenty of article one, Bill of Rights, to section two, section three and section four of article fire, section twentynight, acction forty and to souther forty-eight of article twelve of general pro-Ylsions of the Constitution of the State of

SECTION 1. Be it resolved by the Legie lature of the State of Texas. That section twenty of article one, Bill of Rights of the Constitution of the State of Texas, he so amended as to hereafter read as follows to wit. SEC. 20. No power of suspending laws in the State shall be exercised except by the

Legislature.

SED, 2. That section 2, section 3 and section 4 of article 5 of the said. Consiliration, be so amenued as to be real consiliration, be so amenued as to be real as follows, to-wit: Section 2. The Supremic Court shall consist of one Chief Justice and four Associate Justices, any three of whost shall constitute a quorum. They shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senses for a term of nine years. All vacancies shall be filled for the ndexpired term. If a vacancies are a term of nine years, a term shall as a vacancies and the section of a vacaticy shall occur, or a term shall ex-pire when the Senate is not in session, the Governor shall fill the same by appoint-ment, which shall be sent to the Senate within ten days after that body shall as-semble, and if not confirmed the office shall immediately become vacant.

The Supreme Court shall have appellate jurisdiction only, which is civil jurisdiction only, which is civil causes. jurisdiction only, which in civil cauces, shall be co-extensive with the limits of the State. The Supreme Courf and the judges thereof, shall have power to issue the writ of habeas corpus, and under such regulations as may be prescribed by law, may issue the writ of mandamus and such other writes as may be necessary to enforce its own jurisdiction. The Supreme Court shall also have hower to assertain such matters of fact as may be necessary to the proper success of its jurisdiction.
