When the puppy grows old enough to sut meat, it is fed in the morning and sent out with the sheep. It stops with them because it is accustomed. As they get full the dog gets hungry. At length; impatient to return where it hopes to get another piece of meat, it begins to tease and worry its mother, and finally starts her toward home; the other sheep fo. low, and thus the whole flock is brought in. 



To all to whom these presents shall come WHEREAS, The Legislature of the State of Texas by a joint resolution passed June 4th, 1873, has proposed certain amendments to the Constitution of said State, which joint resolution reads as follows,

8sc. 2. That section 2, section 3 and section 4 of article 5 of the said Constitution, be so amenned as to be eafter read as follows, to wit: Section 2. The Supreme Court shall consist of one Ohief Justice and four Associate Justices, any three of whom shall constitute a quorum. They shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of nine years. All vacancies shall be filled for the udexpired term. If a vacancy shall occur, or a term shall expire when the Senate is not in account, the Governor shall fill the same by appointment, which shall be sent to the Senate within ten days after that body shall aswithin ten days after that body shall as-aemble, and if not confirmed the office shall immediately become vacant.

SEC. 3. The Supreme Court shall have appellate jurisdiction only, which in civil jurisdiction only, which in civil causes, shall be co-extensive with the limits of jurisdiction only, which in civil causes, shall be co-extensive with the limits of the Stete. Appeals from interlocatory judgments may be allowed with such exceptions and under such regulations as the Legislatore may prescribe. The Supreme Court and the judges thereof, shall have power to issue the writ of habeas corpus, and under such regulations as may be prescribed by law, may issue the writ of mandamus and such other writs as may be necessary to enforce its own jurisdiction. The Supreme Court shall also have hower to assertain such matters of jact as may be necessary to the proper exercise of its jurisdiction.
