

In my last communication I have had much to say that was favorable of the New Braunfels people, but ly live things in the city besides the tribute of praise is most cer, the liveous are a few live republitainly deserved; but politically, New Braunfels is given to eccentricities. It happens occasionally that they draw their political inspi-ration from the neighboring village of Seguin; but, from my opportuni ties of observation I was convinced the impression was gaining ground they had been duped, and a natural desire not to be so anymore was making itself felt. The number of pronounced Democrats bas herer BUILDERS AND BUILDING been large and is less now than ever. There are several strong focal reasons for the change that is going on, one of which I will mention more definitely afterwards,

Paints, Oils, Window glass and The voters of Comal county went very strong for Hancock, but under no possible circumstances would they do so again, in fact the meu-tion of Hancock is like talking about a rope in the leause of one that has been lung. Owing perhaps to peculiar resemblance in the names, they regard the Hon, Rich. ard Coke as a dishwater modification of Hancock. A prominent citizen told me he considered them both bad eggs, a comparison which the friends of Judge Hancock might regard as odious, now that our B. P. M. C. has been consigned to the silent tomb of political oblivion by

his envious friends. The New Braunfels people went into the Greeley movement with getting them on the CAYOTE, the refreshing energy, and at the instigation of "the Seguin clique." Judge Ireland himself bardly claims, see by the papers, that the movement was altogether successful. Again, Col. Hoffman (the New Braunfels Berends) has not gained any lasting laurels in his legislative capacity; in fact, there seemed to be a disposition manifested among his friends not to send him there anymore, if they would possibly prevent it; although, the recent nomination of Kessler has mitigated his unpopularity. Again, the people of New Brauntels were very much in favor of the 13th Legislature, they listened to the syren song of Ireland siel bis friends, and find

themselves werse deceived than ever. The 13th Legislature was the feather that broke the camel's back. Its attrocities have had the effect of changing almost the entire Ger man element in Texas from ardent friends to bitter enemies. The Ger cy; the party don't know what to mans, everywhere I have been, are almost a unit for Gov. Davis, and this great wave of re-action has had its effect in New Braunfels. The results of the next election will establish this conclusively.

In this Hortontown case there are extraordinary hardships, The most important improvements, a cultivated farms, bave been made since the suit was begun, and con-sequently the hardworking owners see themselves after an occupancy of nearly 40 years deprived of the truits of so many years of toil. But the peculiar bardship in the case is this: two thirds of the land recovered is rocky and nesion, while all the good land is guiden, entirestion. the good land in nucler suitivation. The owners, or ecoupants, are willing to repurchase their lands and improvements at a high figure, but the successful friends of the Germaus, the attornies in the case, will only listen to proposals to sell the whole tract, for which they ask the modest sum of \$38,000. The District Convention recently held at Boerne for the nomination of a Senator and three Representatives has developed the fact that the Republicans are thoroughly tormer convention, not even the democratic, can boast of a larger attendance, or a higher grade of intelligence. The majority of the delegates arrived in Boerne on Friday evening, and the intervening time was spent in discussing the merits and claims of the various candidates. It is a significant fact that none of the delegates had a particular ticket to advocate, and consequently there was no wirepulling, or anything resembling the "cut and dried" proceedings of very many conventions we know of. The nominations are the results of as spontaneous an expression of public sentiment as is possible to be obtained from a convention. There was but one opinion in ref

erence to the re-election for Senator, and although Col. Newton had verbally, and in writing, declined becoming a candidate thereby indicating his intention of refusing to run if nominated, nevertheless, the convention was of the opinion that his decision should not be regarded as final, that it was the duty of every. Republican to consider his duty to his party, and that Col. Newton would acknowledge the force of this argument, in which view of the case the convention was correct. Col. 

Joint resolution proposing amendments to section twenty of article esc, Bill of Rights, to section two, section three and section four of article five, section twentyeight, section forty and to section forty-eight of article twelve of general pro-visions of the Constitution of the State of

SECTION 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas, That section tweaty-of article one, Bill of Rights of the Constitution of the State of Texas, he so amended as to hereafter read as follows

SEC. 20. No power of suspending laws in the State shall be exercised except by the egislature.

SEC. 2. That section 2, section 3 and SEC. 2. That section 2, section 3 and section 4 of article 5 of the said Constitution, be so amenned as to hereafter read as follows, to-wit: Section 2. The Supreme Court shall consist of one Chief Justice and four Associate Justices, any three of whom shall constitute a quorum. They shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consout of the Senate, for a torm of nine years. All vecancies for a torm of nine years. All vacancies shall be filled for the udexpired term. If a vacancy shall occur, or a term shall expire when the Senate is not in session, the pire when the Senate is not in Governor shall fill the same by appointment, which shall be sent to the within ten days after that body sh
