

PROCLAMATION By the Governor of the State of Texas.

To all to whom these presents shall come : WHERMAN, The Legislature of the State of Texas by a joint resolution passed June 4th, 1873, has proposed certain amendments to the Constitution of said State, which joint resolution reads as follows.

Bill of Rights, to section two, section three and section four of article five, section twenty-eight, section forty and to section forty-eight of article twelve of general provisions of the Constitution of the State of Taxas.

RECTION 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas. That section twenty of article one, Bill of Rights of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be so amended as to hereafter read as follows 8EC, 20. No power of suspending laws in the State shall be exercised except by the

Mac. 9. That section 2, section 3 and cetton 4 of article 5 of the said Constitustion, be so amenined as to hereafter read as follows, to wit: Section 2. The Supreme Court shall consist of one Chief Justice and four Associate Justices, any three of whom shall constitute a quorum. They shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of him year. for a term of nine years. All vacancies shall be filled for the udexpired term. If shall be filled for the udexpired term. If a vacancy shall occur, or a term shall expire when the Senate is not in semiourities Governor shall fill the same by appointment, which shall be sent to the Senate within ten days after that body shall assemble, and if not confirmed the office shall immediately become vacant.

SEC. 3. The Supreme Court shall have appellate jurisdiction only, which in civil jurisdiction only, which in civil jurisdiction only, which in civil canses, shall be co-extensive with the limits of the State. Appeals from interlocutory judgments may be allowed with such exceptions and under such regulations as the Legislature may prescribe. The Supreme Court and the judges thereof, shall bave power to issue the writ of habeas corpus, and under such regulations as may be prescribed by law, may issue the writ of mandamus and such other writs as may be necessary to enforce its own jurisdiction. The Supreme Court shall also have hower to assertain such matters of fact as may be necessary to the proper exercise of its jurisdiction.
