**English Women in Politics.**  
The influence of women in politics  
has recently had a practical demon-  
stration in England. Mr. Moncre  
D. Conway writes to the Cincinnati  
Commercial that the late elections at  
Dover and Bath were determined  
more by the wives of the candidates  
than the candidates themselves. In  
the former city, the Tory candidate  
was successful, though it has been a  
Liberal borough heretofore. At  
Bath, two ladies were in the field—  
Mrs. Hayward, the Liberal candi-  
date's wife, and Mrs. Forsythe, the  
conservative of the Conservative side.  
In the instance, the Liberal lady  
carried off the honors, partly be-  
cause she was the first to enter on  
the canvass, and partly because  
she was the more fascinating of the  
two. We apprehend that if Mrs.  
Forsythe were as beautiful and as  
fervent as she is conservative, she  
would not have placed her at a  
disadvantage. The important part  
played in these two elections by  
feminine campaigning is likely to  
make this novelty the striking fea-  
ture in the elections for the next  
Parliament. It is admitted that  
Mrs. Barnett, the Tory lady, won  
over the constituency of Dover from  
its well-established liberalism. At  
Bath, the canvass is stated to have  
been very exciting. Both ladies  
went into the struggle with enthu-  
siasm, drove out in gorgeous equip-  
ages, with partisan colors, as on a  
race-day, pulled up at the shops of  
the tradespeople soliciting votes,  
and even captured the doubtful  
voters and drove them direct to the  
polls. It can be readily conceived  
that there was a new incentive to  
political devotion in all this, and  
that the old stagers, worried out  
and disgusted with stale political  
tricks, would eagerly bite at the  
new bait thrown out to them. Pretty  
faces, sweet words, musical voice,  
bright smiles, variegated ribbons,  
the fascinating rustle of silks,  
the soft pressure of a prettily gloved  
hand, a love of a bonnet, and the  
concealed power of a little bow are  
quite different affairs from the twirl  
of the shillelagh, the fumes of gin,  
and the howl of bustling banners.  
The most hard hearted of electors  
could scarcely resist these new at-  
tractions.
