NEGRO SUFFRAGE NOTHING NEW. "In demanding the right of suffrage for the colored citizens of our State, I do not ask for the establishment of any new principle, or any untried experiment, but that we give practical effect to our own theory of government, by returning to the usages adopted by the founders of the American Republic.

Under the Articles of Confederation, Cougress acted directly upon the subject of suffrage, in the orments, which were to result in State governments. The celebrated ordinance of 23d April, 1874, drafted by Jefferson, authorized the "free males of full age," without distinc-tion of color, to take part in forming these governments; and the still more iamous ordinance of July 13, 1787, vested the right of suf-rage in all the "free male inhabitants of full age," who had certain qualifications of freehold or resi-dence.




