**The austerity of the Early New Englanders.**  
The two hundredth anniversary of the incorporation of Dunstable, an ancient New England town covering territory now occupied by several towns in Massachusetts and New Hampshire, was celebrated the other day. The speaker illustrated the equality of all men before God was rigorously observed. All titles were forbidden Mr. Weld. Even plain, "Mr." was not allowed, either to clergymen or laymen. The "simple prefix of 'Rev.'" was considered an innovation of vanity. The austerity of our fathers was carried into minor matters. Dancing at weddings was forbidden. Walker, one of the colonists, was imprisoned a month for courting a maid without the consent of her parents. Long hair or periwigs, and "superstitious ribbands," to tie up and decorate the hair, were strongly prohibited. All ornament was "a vain show, and beauty a Delilah." Christmas was a popish day, and not to be observed. To turn the back upon the public worship before it was finished and the blessing pronounced was "profane," and was prohibited by law.  
A cage was erected near the meeting house for the confinement of all offenders against the Sabbath. One Sunday, John Atherton, a soldier in Col. Tyng's company, most scandalously profaned the day by setting a piece of an old hat to put into his shoes, which chafed his feet on the march. He was fined forty shillings for his flagrant wickedness. Three months intentional absence from the church brought the offender to the public whipping post. Even in Harvard College students were whipped in the presence of professors and fellow students for grave offenses committed in the chapel. The order of exercises at the infliction of the penalty was, first, prayer; second, the whipping; third a closing prayer. No Sabbath bell "knolled then to church." The plain, unstepped, barn like meeting house never resounded to an organ, or to a profane instrument of any kind. The windows of the humble edifice, neither large nor numerous, were guileless of a pane of glass for fifteen years. Neatness and propriety reigned without and within. A widow kept the meeting house clean and took care that no damage came to the glass. The tithing man kept his eye on the boys in the broad aisle and the "hind seats" that they might be "watched over according to law." Loose stones were cleared away outside the house. A new horse block was set up. All persons were forbidden to tie their horses to the meeting house ladder. No "faithful dog could" bear his master company within the sacred precincts, and every dog was sore afraid of Samuel Gould, who was "chosen dog whipper for the meeting house."

**Why the Democratic State Ticket is Bound to be Defeated.**  
One of the proposed amendments to the Constitution of the State of Texas submitted by the Thirtieth Legislature to be voted for at the approaching election, creates the office of Assessor and Collector, and so takes away the profits of assessing from the justices, and the commission for collecting the taxes from the sheriffs. By it the emoluments now divided among six officers will be concentrated into the hands of one.  
Now, there are five justices and one sheriff in each of the 137 organized counties of Texas, and are as many more citizens who are candidates for those offices. What chance gave the Democratic politicians to carry their State ticket against the direct pecuniary interests of all these candidates? How can the justices continue to get paid for assessing and the sheriffs for collecting, if they don't get the Democratic State Ticket beaten?  
If the Democratic State ticket were to be successful, the justices and sheriffs would be short of the greater part of the pay they now earn and get, and the people would have to pay a convention tax, and the expenses of an election to verify the new constitution besides.  
That's why the Democratic State ticket would be beaten even if none but Democrats were to vote at the election.—Journal.

**Mercury "Stop."**  
The mortgaged and necessary Houston Mercury is in need of somebody to write its editorials who has a respectable knowledge of English diction and style, who has some recollection of the form and requirements of logic; who has the ability to state clearly a thought or a fact, instead of writing it, or about about it; who has at least a faint recollection of the prominent

facts in political history; in short, somebody who can periphrastically state a single proposition, in a single sentence that is grammatically rhetorically correct. We have waded through several columns of what is usually called balderdash, and the single purpose of finding one such sentence from the pen of its present editorial writer, but in vain. Aside from politics and the truth of history, we are concerned for the reputation of Texas journalism, and especially that of Houston, Houston, in former days, was the centre of power in Texas journalism; but alas! "how are the mighty fallen!" Bitter and vindictive enough to throw hot shot, it spits only light froth and dry cotton. Its highest utterances never produce anything beyond the grade of a weak and unseasoned "stop."  
Its editorial leader yesterday morning: "Coke & Hubbard, and Davis and Taylor," is about the biggest, weakest, and most vomit-provoking bucket of slop we have lately encountered. There is not a truth nor a fact in its whole column and quarter. It does not even understand the art of appealing to a single general principle as a basis for its false assertions.—State Journal.

**A Japanese Execution.**  
We have been favored by a correspondent with the following account of a Japanese execution: "I went to see an execution at Yeddo, out of a vile curiosity. I repented of it, but still it was a most extraordinary spectacle, and impressed me very much. The culprits were eight in number, one being a woman. They were all beheaded with a sword. The operation was performed with wonderful dexterity and coolness, and not one of them, even the woman, showed the slightest symptom of fear. There was a space of ground roped off; inside were three holes dug in ground, with a little mound behind each, on which was spread a mat for the criminal to kneel on. On one side of the inclosure were two Japanese officials, in chairs, to see the thing properly conducted. I had a place directly in front of the mounds, at about six feet distance. The criminals were placed in a row, on one side of the inclosure, blindfolded with pieces of paper (they use paper for everything there). What struck me most was the horrid coolness of the executioner's assistant, a good-looking lad of about eighteen; he went up to each poor wretch in his turn, gave him a tap on the shoulder, led him up to the mound, and made him kneel on the mat; he then stripped his shoulders, made him stretch out his neck, said 'That will do,' and in a flash the man's head was in the hole in front of him, and his bleeding neck was, as it were, staring me in the face. The assistant, still with the same pleasant smile, picked the head up, threw some water over the face to wash off the blood and mud, and presented it to the Japanese officials, who nodded and signed to go on with the next. The assistant then gave the corpse a blow between the shoulders to expell the blood, and finally threw the carcass aside like a log of wood. He then repeated the same pleasant programme with the next. I never thought a man's head could come off so easily; it was like chopping cabbage, only accompanied with a peculiar and most horrid sound—that of cutting meat, in fact. There was a dense crowd of Japanese present, including many women and children. These people never ceased to eat, smoke and chatter the whole time, making remarks on the performance, and even occasionally laughing, just as if they were at a theater. The executioner poured water on his sword between each decapitation, and one wets a knife in order to cut India rubber."
