**MISCELLANEOUS.**

**Mexican Judges.**  
"As a rule, throughout the Mex-  
ican Republic," says a magazine  
writer, "an alcalde (corresponding  
to our justice of the peace) is a per-  
son capable of being purchased.  
Being open to corruption, one can  
approach him without hesitation  
with a bribe. In every community  
there are men who never lose a  
case. These favored few at times  
lose of their ability to purchase a  
judgment or verdict, and always  
degenerate for the same when they  
prosecute or defend. Rarely indeed,  
except in times of revolution, does  
a rich man suffer imprisonment, and  
never is he seen in the chain-gang  
by reason of criminal prosecution.  
Gold has the same virtue for an  
locking doors and snapping hand-  
cuffs as crowbars and files. Gold  
would have released Maximilian  
had he consented to use it. The  
offer was made and accepted; the  
liberal officers were bought by the  
score; but the Austrian Prince pre-  
ferred to be slaughtered rather  
than violate his too-keen sense of  
honor. When Santa Anna committed  
the treason that Iturbide had  
committed, that Maximilian had  
been charged with, he did not suffer  
a similar penalty. He is Mexi-  
can, and knew what meant to use  
for his freedom, and he got it. It  
is true that Juarez, who organized  
that court for Santa Anna's con-  
viction, in his anger ordered the  
court in prison for not shooting the  
vagrant ex-President. But gold  
softened the rigors of confinement  
in the casements of Udon, and the  
doubtless of the ex-President in  
several years of comfort to the judi-  
cial trier."

**Origin of the Yosemite.**  
Professor Joseph Le Conte, of the  
University of California, differs  
from Professor Whitney in his ideas  
of the origin of the Yosemite Val-  
ley. The latter attributes the for-  
mation of this wonderful valley to  
the sudden engulfment of a portion  
of the Sierras, but Professor Le  
Conte is of the opinion that this, as  
well as other deep perpendicular  
gorges of the West, were formed on  
a smaller scale, have been saved out  
by the action of glacial. Profes-  
sor Le Conte observes that glacia-  
l forms are unmistakably ob-  
servable at many points on the walls  
of the valley, and in some places  
even to the brink. In the contour  
of the walls of the valley, their  
rounded form, where the rock is  
hard, standing unbroken and with-  
out debris at the base, he finds  
proofs of glacial erosion. On the  
north side of the valley every pro-  
jecting shoulder is thus rounded,  
and in some cases the smoothness  
is so complete, even at a considera-  
ble height, that the rocks glisten in  
the sunshine. The wonderful dome  
like form of nearly all the promi-  
nent points about this valley, and  
their striking resemblance to gla-  
cial forms, can not, he says, be  
overlooked. The whole surface of  
the country is monotone on a huge  
scale. If so, then the greater  
domes about the Yosemite have  
been formed in a similar manner.  
If so, then the whole surface of this  
region, with its greater and smaller  
domes, has been molded beneath a  
universal ice sheet, which moved  
on with steady current, careless of  
domes.

**TERrible Game of Cards—A Hu-  
man Life at Stake.**  
A game of cards in which a hu-  
man life was at stake was played on  
the 9th of September at the Ritter  
Hotel, Heidelberg, by four young  
students, one of whom, Silfred  
Meyer, was an American from Chi-  
cago. It appears that the four men  
and formerly best intimate friends,  
and they met, it seems, on the  
above day at the Swamp Tavern,  
where they drank a good deal, and  
finally began to quarrel. One of  
them, Count Ottendorf, called Meyer  
a cowardly Jew, whereupon the  
latter promptly challenged him.  
Ottendorf accepted the challenge  
immediately. Meyer, in a tone of  
great excitement, proposed that all  
four should repair to the Ritter  
Hotel and there play a game of  
"sixty-six." The loser should shoot  
himself with a pistol. This propo-  
sal was accepted, and the four  
students repaired to the hotel. They  
ordered wine and cards to be  
brought up to a private room, and  
Ludeken, one of the four procured  
two loaded pistols from a neighbor-  
ing armorer. The fourth student  
dealt the cards, and Ottendorf and  
Meyer seated themselves, a pistol  
lying by the side of each. The first  
few minutes the game remained all  
most even. But then Meyer obtain-  
ed a single advantage, and Otten-  
dorf, seeing that he was lost, sud-  
denly, jumped up and exclaimed:  
"Adieu, my friends," seized his pis-  
tol, and shot himself through the  
right temple. He fell a corpse to  
the floor, while his companions  
stood as if petrified for a moment,  
then hurried to the room. When  
the proprietor of the hotel hastened  
into the room he found the dead  
corpse lying on the floor. He gave  
an alarm, and the police started in  
pursuit of the fugitive students.  
Late in the afternoon they succeeded  
in arresting Immlieh, who made the  
above statement. Meyer and Lude-  
ken escaped across the French fron-  
tier. Ottendorf was the son of a  
wealthy landed proprietor in West-  
phalia. At the time of his death  
he was only nineteen.

**SAD CASUALTY.**—A child about  
two and a half years old, of Mr.  
and Mrs. F. G. Lane, fell into an  
open tank on Tuesday, and was  
drowned. He was sent out on a mes-  
sage in parental play, and in trying  
to execute the message, it is prob-  
able it lost its balance, and fell into  
the water. Life was gone when it  
was found.

**FATTI'S LATEST RIVAL.**  
Belasco, the Velvet-Tongued The Prima  
Donna Who is Back Them All.  
If the Paris and London journals are to  
be trusted, M. Mascher-brachsch has just  
discovered, and has revealed at the Pa-  
riettes, another Fatti. Under date of  
October 10, the correspondent of the Daily  
Telegraph writes: "To-night there was a  
singular array of beauty to welcome a de-  
butante whose name is destined to be soon  
everybody's mouth. I ventured, some-  
ten days ago, to prophesy from a single  
hearing in a small salon, that she would  
prove an immense success on the stage,  
and the event has more than justified my  
prediction. Not since the eventful night  
twelve years ago, when Adelina Patti elec-  
trified the theatre, has there appeared  
who longed into Covent Garden just to  
see a girl from America's coast out,  
have I been present at any such thorough-  
ly hopeful debut. Mlle. Belasco's success to-  
night has only been a very few months  
engagement in serious duty, and has never  
before appeared on stage. She is Russian  
by birth, her name being slightly modified  
to suit the pronunciation of Western lips.  
She has a genuine contralto voice, extend-  
ing far into the soprano register, so that  
all musical operas parts will be easy with  
in her compass. The voice is of peculiarly  
rich, full, sweet, and if I may venture  
on the expression, velvety texture. Its  
flexibility will be acknowledged if any  
of the songs that she sang at the Grand  
Theatre, as though to the manner trained.  
No sover part part can be imagined than  
that of Rosini—a character that Adelina  
Patti may be said to have made her own,  
and parts will attest it a recommendation  
that Mlle. Belasco need make no other  
claim, but can sing the music as well as  
write. The very first phrases of 'The ves-  
pers of' evoked sympathetic murmurs of  
approval, and from this point until the  
curtain fell the applause went on increas-  
ing. The passages of the calceator were  
articulated with surprising precision, and in  
the duet with Fatti, the young lady ex-  
hibited a great deal of charming capric-  
tude, as well as an remarkable musical apti-  
tude. She has much to learn in the art  
of stage demeanor, but she is naturally grace-  
ful, bright and animated.

taken if she is not every quality of a fine  
artist. It will be her own fault if she  
does not succeed. The reason that I insist  
upon to-night's success is that, vastly as  
debutante charmed the audience, I thought  
I saw in her performance much more prom-  
ise than of actual accomplishment. And  
this I take to be the best characteristic of  
a first appearance.

We extract the following from a letter recently received from Vienna.

One of the most attractive features in the machinery department of the Vienna exhibition, is the collection of Fairbanks & Company's Scales, and a large crowd is frequently gathered around it.
