Origin of the Yesemite.

Professor Joseph Le Coute, of the University of California, differs from Professor Whitney in his ideas of the origin of the Yosemite Valley. A Colored Jury.

TWELVE SABLE MEN AND TRUE SENTENCE ONE OF THEIR RACE TO DEATH FOR MURDER.,

WILMINGTON, N. C., Nov. 4. The trial of Dave Martin and Jimmy anderson, both negroes, for the murder of white boy named Carter, in September ast. was brought to a close Monday, resulting in the acquittal of Anderson and the conviction of Dave Martin of murder in the first degree. The remarkable feature of this trial lies in the feet that the entire jury were negroes. The accused were negroes, while the victim of the murder was white. The judge sentenced the prisoner to be executed on the 28th instant, in doing which he remarked that upon the whole it was gratifying to see and know that in a case of such importmee, involving such delicate relations beween the white and black race, a jury of black men had rendered a verdict accord ing to evidence and according to law. This verdict presents a striking contrast to one just rendered in another State, involving similar impertant consequences to them. Here a jury of twelve negroes, probably a majarity of them unable to read and write, gave such a verdict as the highest degree of intelligence and integrity demanded. There a jury of a different race, white sidered established and proved facts, so declared by the judge on the bench and so scknowledged by public sentiment. So much for the difference of justice as ad ministered in North Carolina. His Houer regarded this fact as worth the calin consideration of statesmen and law-makers. Honest ignorance s hould be recognized, while intelligent vice should be scorned. The community had no reason to fear se 8-11 73 dlw wim long as men were governed by their convictions of what was right. He would not thank them for what they had done; no one should be thanked for doing his sim-

one should be thanked for doing his simple duty. He had no doubt that a jury of white men, under similar evidence, would have convicted a white boy of murdering a negro boy. The verdict, at least, had not been influenced by any feeling of race of caste. It certainly presented food for reflection. 
