Coke for a Constitutional Con-vention.

The Coke secession party are

More Democratic Corruption. Among the meanest of the many nean things which the Democratic 13th Legislature did, was the passage of a joint resolution, requiring the payment of treasury warrants without regard to date or number. t is well known that the 12th egislature adjourned without making any appropriation for the support of the State Government for the fiscal year comencing September 1st, 1872, and consequently the em ployees and officers of the State Government labored on without compensation, waiting for the "gallous" 13th to meet and make the necessary appropriation for their support. 




