The people of Bexar county have been more severely humbugged by railroad companies than any other community in the United States.

Not only has this obligation been violated, but no indemnity bond has been filed by the Columbus Road within 60 days, according to the written contract, and no explanation or apology is made to the long suffering people of Bexar for this shameful treatment.

The American and Portuguese consuls presented to the delegates a protest against the seigure of certain portions of this convent, which belong to their respective nations. 
