4th, 1873, has proposed certain amendments to the Constitution of said State which joint resolution reads as follows,

yiz:
Joint resolution proposing amendments to section twenty of article one, Bill of Rights, to section two, section three and section four of article five, section twenty-eight, section forty and to section forty-eight of article twelve of general provisions of the Constitution of the State of

SECTION 1. Be it resolved by the Legis-lature of the State of Texas, That section twenty of article one, Bill of Rights of the stitution of the State of Texas, be so uded as to horeafter read as follows

SEC. 20. No power of suspending laws in the State shall be exercised except by the REPAIRED AND WARRANTED .

SEC. 2. That section 2, section 3 and section 4 of article 5 of the said Constitu-tion, be so amenned as to hereafter reads as follows, to-wit: Section 2. The Supreme as follows, to-wit: Section 2. The Supreme Court shalt consist of one Chief Justice and four Associate Justices, any three of whom shall constitute a quorum. They shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of nine years. All vacancies shall be filled for the udexpired term. If aball be filled for the udexpired term. If a vacancy shall-occur, or a term shall expire when the Senate is not in seasion, the Governor shall-fill the same by appointment, which shall be sent to the Senate within ten days after that body shall ascemble, and if not confirmed the office shall immediately become vacant.

SEC. 40. (Special Disparch to the St. Louis The Position of the Govern-

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18. The position of the government as heretofore given with reference to Cuban affairs was not changed by the Cabinet meeting to-day, although the subject was discussed for two hours. No information has been received at the State Depart ment which places the case in a different attitude, and it is not now expected at the department that the main case, as between our gov-ernment and Spain, will be deter mined until after the meeting of Congress. The fact that the post tion of the President must be taken before the assembling of Congress was considered, and that this must depend upon the course of the MadridGovernment during the next ten days on the facts as they exist. To day he has decided upon the ground he will take, and this ground has been explained to the Cabinet. and is approved by every member

is as tollows: The President has made certain demands upon Spain for reparation. That government though urged to act promptly, has as yet neither admitted the justice of these demands nor urged the injustice of them. She has not even the State. ## TELEGRAPHIC.

FOREIGN NEWS. WASHINGTON, Nov. 21-The city is ex cited over the probabilities of a war with Spain. Romers of all kinds are in circulation in addition to the interest in the situation. These, however, have no official confirmation beyond the news telegraphed at noon. The State Department is investigating the real status of the Virginius in the Treasury Department. The Navigations Division finds no reason to believe that any irregularity exists in the Virginiae registry papers. This fact was communicated to the Secretary of State by the Secretary of the Tressury, and received attention by the Cabinet to-day. Copies of all papers submitted to this session of the Cabinet were opened earlier than usual, and continued until four o'cleck. All the secretaries were present. It was the largest session during Grant's administration. Subsequently Fish and Robesen held a conference. The session was eccupied the whole time with the Virginius matter and the attending complications. The members were dumb regarding the details and proposed action. The American legation was characterized as brutal and was unexceptionably received open her business at as unreasonable that the Ministry should

It is still untikely that other than precantionary measures will be taken until Congress acts.
