**PROCLAMATION** By the Governor of the State of Texas.

To all to whom these presents shall come:
WHEREAS, The Legislature of the State
of Texas by a joint resolution passed June
4th, 1873, has proposed certain amendments to the Constitution of said State,
which joint resolution reads as follows,
vis:

vis:
Joint resolution proposing amendments
to section twenty of article one, Bill of
Rights, to section two, section three and
section four of article five, section twentyeight, section forty and to section forty-eight of article twelve of general pro-visions of the Constitution of the State of

Texas.
SECTION 1. Be it resolved by the Legis-lature of the State of Texas. That section twenty of article one, Bill of Rights of the Congtination of the State of Texas, he so smended as to hereafter read as follows:

SEC. 2. That section 2, section 3 and section 4 of article 5 of the said Constitu-tion, be so amenned as to hereafter read as follows, to-wit: Section 2. The Supreme as follows, to-wit: Section 2. The Supreme Court shall consist of one Chief Justice and four Associate Justices, any three of whom shall constitute a quorum. They shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of nine years. All vacancies shall be filled for the udexpired term. If shall be filled for the adexpired term if a vacancy shall occur, or a term shall expire when the Senate is not in session, the Governor shall fill the same by appointment, which shall be sent to the Senate within ten days after that body shall assemble, and if not confirmed the office shall immediately become vacant.

PEC. 3. The Supreme Court shall have appellate jurisdiction only, which in civil causes, shall be co-extensive with the limits of the State. Appeals from interinentory judgments may be allowed with each exceptions and under such regulations as the Legislature may prescribe. The Supreme Court and the judges thereof, shall have power to issue the writ of babeas corpus, and under such regulations as may be pre-scribed by law, may have the writ of mandanus and such other write as may be necessary to enforce its own jurisdic-tion. The Supreme Court shall also have hower to assertain such matters of tact as may be necessary to the proper exercise of SEC. 4. The Supreme Court shall hold its measion at the Capital, and two other places in the State.

8mc 3. That section twenty-eig' t, section forty and section forty eigh of article twelve of general provisions of the said constitution, be so amended as to hereafter read as follows: to wit. SEC. 28 In each read as follows: to wit. SEC. 28 In each and every organized county in the State, there shall be an assessor and collector of taxes, elected by the people at the next ensuing general election and every font years thereafter, who shall assess the property and collect the taxes so assessed in coformity to such laws as new exist, or in coformity to such laws as now exist, or may be enacted hereafter by the Legisla-ture, relative to the assessment and collec-

SEC. 40. The Legislature shall not pass local or special laws in any of the follow-ing cummerated cases, that is to say for ing commerated cases, that is to cay for locating or changing county seats; regulating the practice in Courts of Justice; regulating the dutice and jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace and constables; providing for changes of venue in civil and criminal courts; incorporating cities or towns or changing or amending the charter of any city or village; providing for the management of common schools, regulating the racts of interest on money, remitting, fines, penalties or forfeitures, changing the law of descent in all other cases when a general law can be made apcases when a general law can be made applicable no special law shall be enacted; or in any case when a general law can be made applicable; me special law shall be enacted. The Legislature shall enact general laws providing by the cases before enumerated in this section, and for all other cases which in its independent case. other cases which in its judgement may be provided by general laws, and, whereas a-ction 50 of article 12 of the constitution action 50 of article 12 of the constitution provides that such proposed amendments shall be duly published in the public prints of this State at least three months befor the next general election of Representatives, for the consideration of the people, and it shall be the duty of the several returning officers at the next general election which shall be thus holden to open a poll for and make a return to the Servicery of State of the names of all those voting for Representatives who have voted an anch proposed amendments. Now therefore, I, Edmind J. Davis Governor of Texas by virtue of the authority vested in by me the constitution and laws of this State, do bereby order and direct that at in by me the constitution and laws of this State, do bereby order and direct that at the next general election, vis. On the dirst Tuesday, being the 2nd day of December A. D. 1873, the polls be opened to receive the votes of those who desire to vote on said amendments, and the tickets used shall have on them the words "For the Amendments" or "Against the Amendments" or "Against the Amendments." The amendments being voted for as a whole sither for or, against. It will be observed that the caption of the above recited for joint resolution would seem to indicate a proposed amendment to Section furty-eight of Article twelve of the Constitution, but no such a mendment is prestitation, but no such amendment is pro-posed in the body of the resolutions, there fore it will not be considered.

Returns will be made to the Secretary of the State of the names of all persons voting for Representatives who have voted on such proposed amendments as provided in Section 50 of Article 13 of the Constitution. Said election to be condusted in all other respects in sensurfaces with the provisions of an 'act regulating elections' Approved March 31st 1873, and an act smeeding the same approved April 1st 1873.



#### The Situation.

Our advices from Eastern Texas concerning the election are throughout tavorable to the Republican party. The time-honored principles of the Democracy have lost their fued. hold with the people of Texas, and as a progressing people the Texans will vote for the Party of the future and quit indulging in the ideas of the past. The are some people in this com munity, who call themselves simonpure Republicans and class well with the simon-pure Democrats. They are infallible in their opinions like the Pope and fully convinced that offices are exclusively made for themselves and nobody else. 
