On the evening of the 22nd in-stant, much confusion was caused blo's Garden, consequent upou the sudden disappearance of Pau-lies Markham. When the hour for the performance arrived, Stalacta was missing, and Lizzie Kelsy was obliged to fill the role, as she has ever since. It was subsequently ascertained that Pauline had left for parts unknown by the 5 o'clock train from Jersey City, in company with the habitual frequenter at Niblo's known as General McMahon, formerly of the Confederate army. McMahou had, it is said, a proclivity for lavishing colossal bouquets upon the fair Markham, as she nighly sparkled on the stage. Fair Pauline's new admirer undertook to foot a bill of \$55 a week at the Crittenden flouse for her and her maid. They occupied a parlor and two bedrooms. Markbam, disdaining a cheap locomotion, rode night ly to the theater in a coupe, and as she returned McMahon would enter the vehicle as it passed the corner of Broadway and Houston street. The General, finally, finding it necessary to leave the city, Pauline consented to relinquish her engagement without notice to the managers, and accompany him. He left the bulk of his baggage as security for a board bill of \$100 at his hetel, and liquidated \$110 due La Bella Panline at the Crittenden by a draft for \$200, for which \$30 in change was returned. A Broadway florist, named Hoffbeimer, had served about \$1,500 at different times for about \$1,500 at different times for bouquets ordered by the General, but a bill of \$425 still remained unpaid. Hearing by chance of Me. Mahon's departure, he posted with Detective Nugent to the railroad station, and presented his account as the train started. While on the way to Newark McMahon offered Hoffbeimer a draft for \$4,000 on Ballstop's Coal Company, of Texas, as security, requesting him to guard it carefully, as he would pay \$425 and redeem it in seven days. Hoftheimer therefore allawed him to depart. Pauline appeared at first to part. Pauline appeared at first to manifest no interest in the proceed ings, but when McMabon observed that he had no money, she turned and remarked: "I'll get out some of my diamonds, and you can give them as collateral;" but to this pro-position McMahon very strongly objected, averring that the arrange-ment he had just concluded would prove satisfactory to all concerned. McMalion was major in the army during the late war, and at its close took up his residence in this city. He boarded in a fashionable hotel during all last winter and a portion of the summer following. His rooms were of the best the house afforded, and involved a heavy expenditure of means. But their occupant was always in possession of ample funds, and spent money laviably until the opening of the panic, when he ap peared to have suffered heavy losses, betokening an approaching con dition of impecuniosity. His boardbill, after being permitted to run considerably beyond the period when payments are usually demanded, was presented to him for payment, but he stated his inability to meet it at the time, and having run in debt at the hotel for six week's board, he, two weeks ago, changed his place of residence to a less costly

abode, leaving his baggage in pos-session of the hotel proprietors un-til such time as he could arrange a settlement of his indebtedoess. McMahon is described as a man of commanding presence, about 36 years of age, and a person who nev-er wore a necktie. In lieu of this, he displayed invariably a large diamond stud, in place of the proverhi-al collar button. He is reported as having a wife and child living with his relations in Galveston, Texas, and during a portion of the past summer they resided with him at a hotel at Long Branch. He was usually called General McMahon, and was the gentleman who furnished Manager Greenwall 2 years ago with money to open Lina Ed win's theater for the appearance of the Chapman sisters.

#### The Cuban Affair.

The Spanish American protocol has been signed by Mr. Fish and the Spanish minister Polo and approved of by the Spanish government. So far so good. We know the stipulations of this treaty are not satisfactory to a large portion of the citizens of the United States; still, it they are complied with, we think the United States have defended the honor of their flag manfully and given a lesson to Spain that will be heeded in future. 
