2. Washington Story.

There is a little story current just
now, that runs thus: The President,
Gen. Sherman, and our small Secre-
tary of the Treasury, occupied a
box at Ford's Opera House a few
evenings since. The star performer
for the occasion was "Little Nell,"
and during the representation she
sang a song, improvised for the oc-
casion, in which there were several
local hits, and among them the
following:

And there is one great financier,
He'd pay out his last dime,
In remaining specie payment,
Five dollars at a time?
The President immediately be-
came convulsed. He snatched Rich-
ardson on the back, and laughed
until he was red in the face. The
audience, though a little late about
it, comprehended the Executive
joke, and broke in a roar that was
standing to the great financial
problem. This is the first time the
President was ever known to
laugh in the theater. He feels en-
couraged to take Richardson with
him when he goes in future.

The Roman Inquisition.

The Roman journals call attention
to the fact that at the present time
an institution called the "Holy Ro-
man Inquisition" is existing in Rome.
Strange as it may seem in the nine-
teenth century, such is the fact. It
is asked why the government per-
mits the society in question to car-
ry on its operations, and the answer
must be that it can not prevent it.
The power of the Inquisition is now
reduced to declaring that such a
person is not a member of the com-
munion of the Catholic Church.
The Popes Romano writes on this
subject:

"It is important to know that
many people believe it an anomaly
that there should exist still in Rome
this holy office of the Inquisition—
that Rome, where there is a Liberal
statue, the presence of a Parliament,
and where the pulchery is in ruins.
This institution performs its func-
tions regularly, as if the Italian na-
tion were still under clerical domi-
nion. The Italian government can
not and ought not to tolerate
this permanent endeavor to under-
mine the conscience, the liberty of
the citizens. It would be an offense
to believe that the civil authority
can any longer tolerate with impu-
nity this enormous abuse; and, in-
deed, if the civil power should not
intervene to protect the Roman
citizens against the usurpations of
the Church, which now believes
herself in the full plenitude of her
power, everyone would have a right
to ask what Rome had gained in
the way of liberty and human pro-
gress by the fall of the Temporal
Power."

DELEGATE CANNON, the Mor-
mon, was admitted to his seat in
the House of Representatives, on the
assumption that—his credentials
being in proper form—he had a
prima facie right to that privilege.
Mr. Merriam, of New York, who
knows more about curbsome brok-
erage business than he does about
law, made an effort to prevent this
result by presenting a resolution
declaring that Mr. Cannon is ac-
cused of certain illegal practices.
The world knows that Mr. C. has
four wives and any ungiven number
of those "sealed" to him. What
the world knows Mr. Merriam is
laxly capable of knowing, and it
is, therefore, possible that the il-
legal practices referred to in the re-
solution may have been an allusion
to Mr. Cannon's Mormon practi-
ces. If some lawyer had handled
the case it is certain that preced-
ents would have been cited to show
that the House has on previous
similar occasions refused to allow
regularly-accredited members ac-
cused of illegal practices to take
their seats; but fortunately for
Cannon the lawyers were on his
side. Messrs. Butler, Cox, Hoar,
Potter and others insisted that the
prima facie evidence embraced in his
credentials should not be ignored.
If Mr. Merriam had been lawyer
enough to advance the suggestion
that the four-wived Mormon had
taken the "endowment oath," which
as legally established, proves him
to be disloyal to the United States,
a different aspect of the case would
have been presented. The House
would then have been able to act
intelligently, for its own protection,

under constitutional authority to
judge of the qualifications of its
own members, and would no doubt
have rejected the claims of the
licentious traitor to recognition as
an associate of the law-makers of
the nation. As it is, the Mormons
have gained by the blundering man-
agement of the case against them
the first step in the contest to retain
their foothold in the West.
